Parents of 2020 Confirmation Candidates: This message is to notify you of the new date for Confirmation: Wednesday, October 7 at 7:00 PM with Bishop Quinn at St Joseph Church. This is for the candidates from St. Joe's and Christ the King who didn't receive the sacrament last spring due to Covid-19. Social distancing and other safety

protocols will be followed per usual in the church. More info will follow soon regarding confirmation meeting/rehearsal in St. Joseph Church.

This past week, Bishop Quinn renewed the consecration of the Diocese of Winona-Rochester to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Tuesday, September 8, the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He encourages all parishes to do the same, so we will renew our consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary at the 5:30 PM Mass on October 3.

The Minnesota Catholic Conference (MCC) and the Catholic Advocacy Network (CAN), with the endorsement of Bishop Quinn, would like parishes to do a Candidate Town Hall. MCC/CAN states: "Events like this are often successful due to the efforts of a dedicated parish leader who is willing to step up and take ownership of the project." Is anyone willing to do this? A little note I would like to make: we are all called to participate in society and allow the good that comes from our faith shine like a bright light upon everyone. The first commandment states that we shall not have other gods besides the Lord God. When we idolize a political party, we make that party like our god, and therefore sin against the first commandment. What makes for good citizenship is upholding the dignity of every person "made in the image and likeness of God." We vote the issues and not the candidate. That is why the Candidate Town Hall is important, again quoting MCC/CAN: "...people in the pew need to know who the candidates are to make an informed vote and then begin to form a relationship with elected officials to promote life and human dignity. Those relationships can start by bringing the candidates into the parish community to consider issues they may not hear about anywhere else."

Forgiveness. Mercy. This is God. This makes the Church. Without this, we are outside of God and outside the Church. With mercy and forgiveness, we are in the embrace of God. May today's words from Sacred Scripture soften our hardened hearts and allow God to use us as instruments of mercy. "Forgive your neighbor's injustice; then when you pray, your own sins will be forgiven" (Sirach 28:2). Jesus has done that for all of us sinners! "Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?' Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt. So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart" (Matthew 18:33-35). Jesus allowed His heart to be pierced, such was His love for all of humanity! "Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make our hearts like unto Thine" (from the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus).

Directives for safe celebration of Mass during COVID-19 (Summary)

- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains dispensed until further notice, and at this time no one is obliged to receive communion.
- Parishioners may only receive Communion on the hand.
