

2nd collection taken today for the missionary activities of the Catholic Diocese of Lexington.

Today is Catechetical Sunday and this year's theme, "Stay with Us", is taken from the Gospel of Luke as Jesus walked with the two men on the road to Emmaus. They asked Jesus: "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." We will be blessing our catechists at Mass as well as blessing parents and guardians, who play a vital role as the primary catechists of their children. Faith is passed on through the family and at home. Religious education programs and Catholic schools supplement the role of the parents, who lead by word and example at home in the transmission of faith to their children. Let us remember to keep all of our parents, guardians, catechists and children in our daily prayers.

Please keep the priests of the Diocese in your prayers as we meet for Presbyteral Days this week.

All three readings today speak about mercy. Mercy is at the heart of Jesus' mission. The Church is not the Church if it lacks mercy. In our world, we hear newscasts or read newspaper articles about justice sought for the victims of various crimes, felonies, misdemeanors, manslaughters, and murders. We want to protect society from violent criminals and justice says they should serve time for their crime. We used to call prisons "penitentiaries" because it was a place to do "penance" and there was the hope of rehabilitation for criminals. Unfortunately, human justice can be filled with vengeance. Today' readings help us see God's justice, which is mercy. When we pray the "Our Father", let us reflect on our call to be merciful when we pray the words "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us".

The lack of love in a person's life can move them to deeds they will one day regret. May we be open to God's love for us and find ourselves in today's readings. Even St. Paul reflects upon his life and recognizes his sinfulness and where God has taken him from, thus experiencing, using his own words, "I have been mercifully treated". What have we repented from in our lives in order to experience God's mercy? May we be enlightened to our sinfulness in order to also have gratitude like St. Paul: "I am grateful to him who has strengthened me". After all, St. Paul's words are the Good News: "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners." There is hope for everyone! God Love You!!! *fr. Jim Starsinich*
