What do altar candles symbolize and why do they look different in Advent?

For mystical reasons, the Church prescribes that the candles used at Mass and other liturgical functions be made of beeswax. The pure wax extracted by bees from flowers symbolizes the pure flesh of Christ received from His Virgin Mother, the wick signifies the Soul of Christ, and the flame represents His Divinity.



Although the wick and flame are common to all candles, the material of which the candle is made can only properly symbolized the pure flesh of Christ if it's made from the purity of beeswax.

However, a mixture of 51% beeswax and another substance fulfills this symbolism. That's why if you were to look a box of altar candles it would have a label that says "51% beeswax". Candles made wholly of any other material such as tallow (animal fat), stearin, paraffin, or any other material cannot be used for altar candles or the Paschal candle.

There was an interesting exception made to this rule in 1850 for the missionaries in Oceania. It was impossible for them to obtain wax candles, so they were given permission to use whale blubber candles.

Regarding the use of oil lamps as substitutes for candles during the celebration of the liturgy, the Congregation of Divine Worship via the US Conference of Catholic Bishops does not currently permit the use of materials other than wax in the production of altar candles,

"the use of such other materials either as a substitute for or in imitation of candles is not permitted in the liturgy... Furthermore, because of their very nature, imitations of candles should not be used in the liturgy as, for example, "permanent" [plastic] Paschal candles, nor should electric bulbs be used in liturgical celebration. In the interests of authenticity and symbolism, it is likewise unfitting that so-called electric vigil [votive] lights be used for devotional purposes."

With this all understood, why do the altar candles look different in Advent? It has been an ancient custom in the Church that during Advent and Lent unbleached candles are used to denote a time of penance. In Advent, the unbleached candles help to remind us of longing for the coming of Christ at Christmas and that we are to prepare the way of the Lord through penance in anticipation of the joys of His birth.
