



## FR. MCGIVNEY CANONIZATION ARTICLE

Father Michael J. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882 as a mutual aid society He wanted to provide financial support for families having lost their primary breadwinner. He also wanted to ensure that Catholic men could remain strong in their faith. Now 138 years later, his legacy continues to inspire the nearly two million Knights today. Father McGivney died at the age of 38 from influenza thought to be a strain of coronavirus. Fr. McGivney was beatified to sainthood Oct. 31, 2020.

Fr. McGivney, the first American parish priest to be beatified, has long been a hero of working-class Catholics. His first miracle, recognized by the Vatican, occurred in 2015 where an unborn child was cured of a life-threatening case of fetal hydrops. The parents were given no hope. They prayed to Father McGivney and the baby, Mikey Schachle, is now 5 years old.

A second miracle is needed to advance Father McGivney's cause for canonization to Sainthood. We offer this novena to support and advance the cause for sainthood for Blessed Fr. Michael J. McGivney. The novena to be said at the end of the rosary each week can be found below. .

## ST. MATTHEW CALENDAR LOTTERY

This is a fundraiser for St. Matthew School and Parish. 365 daily prizes and 12 special monthly prizes, awarded for each day/month of 2021. Prizes range from \$25 to \$500. ## SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL

December 31, 2020 ends the moratorium on rent collections for tenants. Nationwide, as many as 19 million renters are facing eviction. Our greatest concern is not so much the numbers of neighbors asking for, but the amount they require to avoid eviction. Although renters have been allowed not to pay, the land-lords have been assessing penalty fees on a daily basis that have been accruing. We are not sure how this will all work. Somehow, the Lord will provide; He always does.

Imagine how Mary felt at the birth of Jesus: excited, awed, frightened. Deep faith was her light in the darkness, for Jesus was born during the night of the year when darkness is the longest.

Your gift to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul has brought light into the darkness surrounding the heart of those living in poverty bringing them the real, lasting, and deep joy of Christmas. Thank You!
