KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS COUNCIL 11879 FISH FRY FUNDRAISING GUIDELINES

Purpose: Guidance for St. Matthew parish organizations to request and conduct fundraising at Council 11879 Fish Fry events.

Who can fundraise:

Only organizations directly connected to the St. Matthew parish community and who raise funds to directly benefit the school or parish are allowed to fundraise. The Council 11879 Council Officers must approve all organizations. If you have any questions, please complete a form and the Knights will contact you

Limit on number and frequency of fundraising:

A maximum of 2 organizations will be allowed to fundraise at each fish fry. All approved organizations submitting a request are given equal opportunity to fundraise.

How organizations make a request to fundraise:

To request a fundraising slot, organizations fill out the request form located on the website under the Knights of Columbus pate and submit it no later than February 15 to the parish office. Requests received after this date are considered only if all slots are not already filled. The Council Officers schedule and notify organizations of their dates.

Rules for conducting fundraising:

--Organizations must conduct their fundraising in a respectful and non-aggressive manner

--Organizations must only conduct the fundraising that is listed on their request form

--Organizations must set up NLT 4:30 PM the day of the Fish Fry in the designated area

--Organizations must provide required tables, supplies, and manpower needed for the fundraiser

--Organizations must clean up their area after the fundraising is complete


FOUNDATION FAMILIES

Special Gifts Updated December 2019 <u>New items added!</u>

The following items could not be funded through the annual budgeting channels because of the limited amount of revenue generated in a year. These items remain needed and hopefully a parishioner or group of parishioners might be interested in funding one or more privately. The estimated cost of each item is provided. Please contact the Parish Office if interested, or simply drop your *clearly noted* contribution in the collection basket.

- 1. <u>New computers for our teachers \$12K *down to \$1,900K*</u> Computers have been purchased for most of our teachers. We are still in need of two more computers.
- 2. <u>Concrete pad for dumpsters \$40K</u> A concrete pad is needed to prevent any further damage to our asphalt caused by the heavy garbage trucks that service us.
- **3.** <u>Classroom Lighting update for efficiency est. \$4K</u> *Partially Funded ~2 classrooms completed* Upgrading the classroom lighting would enhance the learning experience and reduce utility bill. Work will be accomplished with Minutemen and our facility manager.
- **4.** <u>Motorized utility vehicle (new or used) \$4.5-6K</u>. To be used by maintenance staff for hauling equipment/supplies throughout our campus.</u>
- 5. <u>Cabinets and counters for our current kitchen. \$600</u>
- 6. <u>Storage/maintenance shed for mowers</u> \$8,500
- 7. Storage container \$2500
- 8. <u>New HVAC system in Building One \$15,000-20,000</u>.
