Purpose: Guidance for St. Matthew parish organizations to request and conduct fundraising at Council 11879 Fish Fry events.

Who can fundraise:

Only organizations directly connected to the St. Matthew parish community and who raise funds to directly benefit the school or parish are allowed to fundraise. The Council 11879 Council Officers must approve all organizations. If you have any questions, please complete a form and the Knights will contact you

Limit on number and frequency of fundraising:

A maximum of 2 organizations will be allowed to fundraise at each fish fry. All approved organizations submitting a request are given equal opportunity to fundraise.

How organizations make a request to fundraise:

To request a fundraising slot, organizations fill out the request form located on the website under the Knights of Columbus page and submit it no later than February 15 to the parish office. Requests received after this date are considered only if all slots are not already filled. The Council Officers schedule and notify organizations of their dates.

Rules for conducting fundraising:

--Organizations must conduct their fundraising in a respectful and non-aggressive manner

--Organizations must only conduct the fundraising that is listed on their request form

--Organizations must set up NLT 4:30 PM the day of the Fish Fry in the designated area

--Organizations must provide required tables, supplies, and manpower needed for the fundraiser

--Organizations must clean up their area after the fundraising is complete


