PARISH AND SCHOOL RECYCLING IOINT PROIECT.

As you may or may not be aware, early last summer our waste removal company informed us that they would no longer recycle metal or plastic, only cardboard. This is a trend throughout the industry as we learned several other companies are also going to cardboard-only for businesses. It was decided at that time, we would stop all recycling. As a result, our monthly bill has increased because we had to go to a larger dumpster to cover the recycling items (now trash).

Now, in a combined school/parish effort, 8th graders will collect recyclables from the classrooms on Friday afternoon and deposit them in bins in the kitchen. Parish organizations who have weekend activities (Athletics, Knights, WWG) will likewise deposit their recyclables in bins in the Kitchen. The recyclables will be hauled to receptacles at Hero's Park (by Hayworth Park) on Sunday evening. Hopefully, this will reduce the trash to a point where we can return to a smaller dumpster for trash thus reducing our monthly payment.

Since the receptacles at Hero's Park also accept glass, we will accept glass from the parish for recycling starting in March. Look for a bin marked "Glass" by the kitchen door in the commons on the weekends.



Work continues on the roof. The wood decking should be complete this week. The electrician will continue his rough in of the sanctuary lights from the ceiling. Following that, a layer of insulation will be layed with a felt sealer. Shingles are not expected to be applied until the Spring. Windows!! Clear glass windows will start to be installed commencing 1 February, lower level first.
