ST. VINCENT de PAUL Just when you think we've turned the corner on this pandemic, it comes back full-force for another round. This time, the government assistance programs are not available and your SVdP volunteers all across the Omaha metro area are seeing the impact. Your dollars helped a woman who had run out of paid leave after surgery by paying her rent. Another single mom of two children, escaped domestic abuse, but was faced with a 7-day eviction notice. We paid her rent with assistance from other SVdP conferences in the area. Your financial contributions prevented a single mother of 8 children from losing their rented home. Her car needed repairs and it was a choice between fixing the vehicle to get to work or paying the rent. A combined financial effort with the Omaha Council, other SVdP conferences and St. Matthew's SVdP prevented this family from being homeless. Our Vincentian volunteer also gave this family food vouchers and bags of fresh food from the St. Matthew drive through food pantry. These families are still in their homes because of your generosity. Without your financial support, none of this would have been possible! Like what we do? Come and join us on the first Tuesday of each month at 5:30pm in the church, lower level conference room.

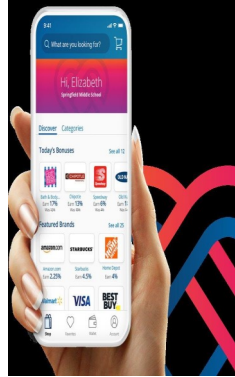

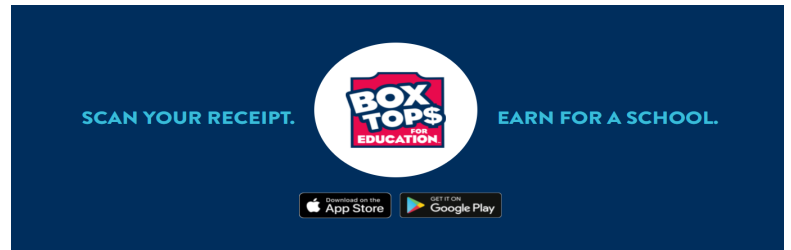

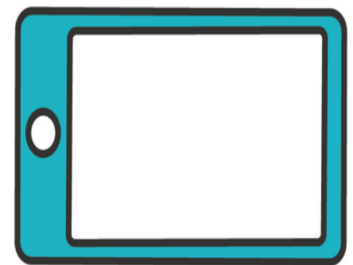
