





- 1. How long have you been a member of St. Matthew parish?

 Marylou and I have been a Parishioner since day one. I was on the first Parish Pastoral Council
- **2.What is your occupation?** Retired for over two years.
- 3. Tell us about your family:
 - Marylou and I got married in 1981 at St. Bernadette Catholic Church in Bellevue. We have two married sons. Shannon and Erin live in Ft. Collins and have three children. Pete and Nancy live in Bennington, Nebraska and have two children. We babysit these two at least every Thursday, often on other days. I had the great joy of taking care of the youngest, now 2-1/2 right after her mother went back to work. I found out quickly why God designed us to have babies when we are young and not at age 65.
- **4.** Name some gifts/talents you may have to offer our parish: I have a great love for the Holy Eucharist; this is shown by the Ministries I am involved in. When the Veteran Home opened Father Stolinski asked me to set up and coordinate the Sunday Communion Service. Since that I have also done the same at Mable Rose. We also take Holy Communion to the homebound of our Parish and to Bellevue Medical Center all of which I recruit, train and schedule. During a planning meeting in 2016 we became aware, through a survey of our Parishioners of a desire for Eucharist Adoration. Father Leo asked me to make this happen. In January of 2017 we started 1st Friday Exposition of Jesus in the Monstrance for 24 hours. Through efforts of others we have added Exposition during the day on the other Fridays. Since retiring I have become involved in the Funeral Services, helping the families plan the Scripture Readings and to take the load off of the families in their time of need.
- 5. What do you see as some of the strengths of our parish currently? We are a truly a Parish Family, many of us know each other's children, grandchildren and even great-grandchildren. We visit each other when there is an illness, taking meals and also the Bread of Life (Holy Communion). We take each other to doctor and PT appointments. Along with this we have a strong prayer life which can be seen in numerous Bible Study groups, Vespers, daily Mass proceeded by the Rosary and Divine Mercy Chaplet, prayer chains for people in need.
