Join us for a daily rosary, Monday through Friday starting at 4:15pm. All are welcome!

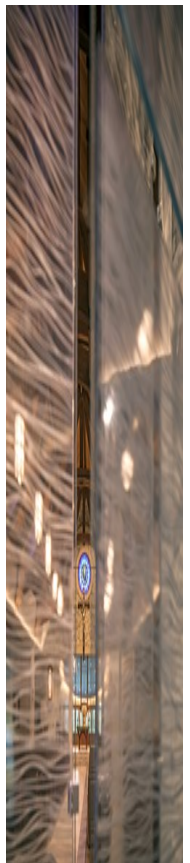


SUNDAY PREP BIBLE STUDY
