WEEKLY SUNDAY HOLY HOUR

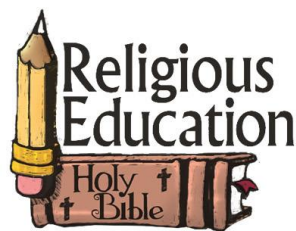

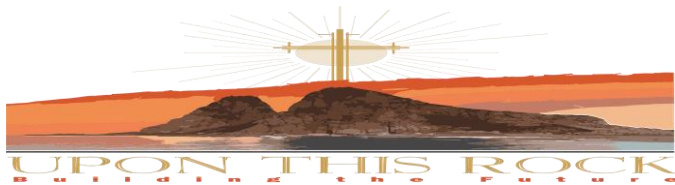

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

This coming week we should start to see some steel going up to support the roof. The initial beams will be placed in the east and west ends of the structure. Also this week, the contractor will start framing (putting up interior wall structure) on the lower level. We will also be waterproofing the structure below ground level to prevent moisture intrusion.

Our subcontractor of the week is Senegal Specialty Contracting, Inc. These are the folks who will be waterproofing our building. Senegal Specialty Contracting, founded in 2002, started in the industry by providing waterproofing and joint sealants to residential homebuilders and general contractors. They have evolved into one of the area's largest commercial and residential waterproofing specialists.
