With concrete in place on the upper level, the lower level has dried out sufficiently to allow completion of running the underground electrical and plumbing conduits. Pouring of concrete in the lower level has been tentatively scheduled for September 23.

As you can see, the forms for the 14' stained glass windows are in place and the front of the Church (east side) is finishing with doors with windows. Once complete and reinforced, the big boom will be back to fill the walls with concrete.



**BEAM SIGNING**
