"So long as we live, they too shall live, for they are now part of us as we remember them."

The Feast of all Souls involves several Catholic beliefs: that some Christians while dying in peace with Jesus might still need purification, that the prayers and good deeds of the living help those who have died, and that there is an intermediate existence between heaven and hell. The liturgical readings for the day combine and emphasize these beliefs, pointing to Christ as the hope of the living and the dead. And the prayers for this feast proclaim a new life in Christ as god's promise, enabling Christians to face death with faith and hope. It is a comfort to us that we can show our love for our family members and friends who have gone ahead of us in death. Death does not take them beyond the reach of our love and prayers.

Ultimately, this feast complements that of All Saints in proclaiming that those who love God, whether alive or dead, are united in a living communion with Christ and with one another.
