Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Church draws her life from the Eucharist. These are the opening words of the great Encyclical on the Eucharist, <u>Ecclesia de Eucharistia</u>, written by Pope Saint John Paul II. In this letter, the pope goes on to say that:

This truth does not simply express a daily experience of faith, but recapitulates the heart of the mystery of the Church. In a variety of ways she joyfully experiences the constant fulfillment of the promise: "Lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age" (Mt 28:20)... The Second Vatican Council rightly proclaimed that the Eucharistic sacrifice is "the source and summit of the Christian life. For the Most Holy Eucharist contains the Church's entire spiritual wealth: Christ himself, our passover and living bread. Through his own flesh, now made living and life-giving by the Holy Spirit, He offers life to men".

The Eucharist is the very heart of who we are. The Eucharist makes us who we are, the Body of Christ and is therefore, the source of Christian life. It is also the summit, the high point of this life, for in the Holy Eucharist can be found every gift that God can to give to us.

There can be no more fitting a way to celebrate the gift of our parish life as well as our newly renovated church, and also to give thanks to God for all His many blessings to us, than by focusing on the gift and mystery of the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. To enable us in this our parish will celebrate the "40 Hours" of Eucharistic Adoration. This will begin with the 10:30 AM Mass on Sunday November 21 and conclude on Tuesday Evening November 23rd. As announced previously our Diocese's most recently ordained priest, Father Philip Maas will offer the sermon at each evenings Liturgy. On Sunday November 21 the evening Liturgy will be at 4PM. On Monday November 22 the evening Liturgy will be at 7PM and on Tuesday November 23rd we will complete our "40 Hours" with the Liturgy of Evening Prayer and Solemn Benediction at 7PM. Each day Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will begin at the morning Mass and continue throughout the day until the evening Liturgy.

I want to wholeheartedly encourage everyone to make every effort to come and spend some time with our Lord each day during these 40 Hours and to attend the evening Liturgies with Benediction and of course our Solemn closing Tuesday Evening.

I want to invite in a special way those who have not been to church for some time. Come and be with the Lord, allow His grace to touch your heart, allow His heart to speak to your heart.

Also in a special way I want to invite those families with young children to come and pray together as a family. Nothing can unite your family more than joining your larger parish family in prayer before the Lord's real presence.

Each of us as individuals, all of us as a community of faith, need very much to come to the Lord and be renewed in heart and mind and soul.

It is my fervent hope that these days will be a great source of blessing for us all.



Tabernacle Candle Intentions


To reserve the lamp for a weekly intention, place a \$10 donation in an envelope marked "Candle" Include in the envelope your name (or donor) and your intention.
