Dear Parishioners,

We are beginning two new Flocknote initiatives. As many of you know who have signed up for Flocknote, it is an easy to use communication platform for parishes that allows texts or emails to be sent to the parish. We use it to send inspirational text messages and to send text reminders about upcoming events and parish news. We can also send messages to specific groups, for example our CCD parents and lectors. We have now created two new groups that I hope you will all join.

The first is called St.NicksNews. Those in this group will be able to receive emails (or texts) from our Parish Public Relations Team. They will be creating emails about many of our parish activities. Creating this new Flocknote group will allow them to send more detailed information about all that we have going on and do so directly and more easily. This way you will not miss out on all the great things happening in our parish.

The second new group is simply called Catechism. If you want to learn more about our beautiful Catholic Faith, then please join the Flocknote group Catechism. By taking only two minutes a day to read a short email, you will be guided in the course of a year through the entire Catechism of the Catholic Church, a whole compendium of our Faith! These emails will come each day Monday-Friday. and will begin on Monday November 22, during our 40 Hours. This will give you plenty of time to join this group, but please don't wait until the last minute to join.

For both of these new groups you will need to add your email to your Flocknote profile if you have not already done so. if you texted to join Flocknote initially you should have received a welcome text inviting you to complete a profile. If you are having trouble please let us know and we will get you some help. You can also go to Flocknote.com and click on the "Help" button.

I hope you have been enjoying Focknote and will sign up for these new groups to enhance our parish communication and learn more about our beautiful Catholic Faith.

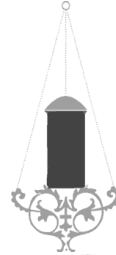
