



'HOUSE CHURCH'

For the first three centuries, Christians did not have churches." They gathered in homes. They came together there for instruction, celebrated baptism, and broke bread in the Eucharist.

Larger homes were chosen as gathering places, with a dining room that could accommodate a fair-sized group. These would also have a fountain with a small pool for baptism, and a courtyard for teachings and discussion.

Excavations have uncovered examples of these "house churches." In the fourth century, when the peace of Constantine "legalized" Christianity, membership increased, creating a need to construct and/or take over large buildings which became the first permanent "churches." These were patterned after the public buildings of the time — the basilica" (a Greek word meaning "royal house"). It was a large rectangular hall, rounded at one end (the appea") from which the ruler presided over meetings. apse") from which the ruler presided over meetings. When Christians took over or constructed such buildings, they simply placed the altar in the rounded part at the end of the hall. The use of such buildings influenced church architecture for centuries, even down to our own day.

But early Christians never lost the sense of the "house church" They prayed in their own homes, had religious symbols there, and in some places it was a custom to bring home a portion of the Eucharistic bread so that they could partake of it each day during the week — their "daily bread" We need to recover this sense of the home as a holy place, the "house church." It is one of our oldest traditions.

New Surge of Phishing Attacks

There has been a new surge of "phishing" attacks and internet scams. Many parishioners may have noticed texts or emails purported from a priest, deacon or ministry leader, asking for sensitive data. Responsible parish leaders would never ask for assistance in this manner. Our clergy will never request monetary favors, especially in the form of gift cards, direct deposits or requests for credit card information.

This is happening nationwide and is becoming more problematic as scammers are developing new and unique schemes to deceive people.

In many cases, the scammers will typically manipulate the "from" email address and name so that it appears to be coming from someone the recipient knows.

The email often asks immediate help in order to get a task done (such as purchasing a gift card or wiring money). Nationally there have also been calls and texts that claim to be the IRS, utility companies, and other institutions, as well as requesting money to avoid going to jail or other penalties.

They can also claim that your loved one is in danger or they are in dire need for charity.

Preventing Scam Texts from Reaching you

Use your cell provider's text alias feature: Almost all major cell providers allow you to set up a text alias that you can use to receive texts.

The texts still come to your phone and you can send texts, but anyone you text sees your alias instead of your actual number. You can then block incoming texts from your real number and give all your friends and family the alias you are using.


Enable the "block texts from the internet" feature if available: Most spammers and "smishers" (those that use sms text phish scams) send texts via an internet text relay service, which helps hide their identities and doesn't count against their text allowances (scammers are notoriously frugal).

Many cell providers will let you turn on a feature that will block texts that come in from the internet.



Protect Yourself: What You Can Do

- Be vigilant in how you use your computer, other devices and software.
- Check sender details carefully. Any suspicious email message should be investigated before re plying. Pay attention to the message content, including attachments and URLs.
- Do not open email you think might be suspicious or just seems odd. You can always call the sender to find out if they had sent you something.
- Do not click on links embedded in an email.
- Do not open attachments if you are not sure of the email's veracity.
- When in doubt, call: If there are questions about any email, do not open it or reply. Instead, pick up the phone and call the parish or the diocese.
- Parish leaders will never solicit funds by email.
 Any request can be verified with the Parish Office.
- Review and regularly update your own passwords. Do NOT reuse passwords or use the same pass word on more than one site. Make sure passwords contain a variety of letters, numbers and special characters.
