Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Corpus Christi (Body and Blood of Christ) is a Eucharistic solemnity, or better, the solemn commemoration of the institution of that sacrament. It is, moreover, the Church's official act of homage and gratitude to Christ, who by instituting the Holy Eucharist gave to the Church her greatest treasure. Holy Thursday, assuredly, marks the anniversary of the institution, but the commemoration of the Lord's passion that very night suppresses the rejoicing proper to the occasion. Today's observance, therefore, accents the joyous aspect of Holy Thursday.

Where the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is not observed as a holy day, it is assigned to the Sunday after Trinity Sunday.

JOHN THE BAPTIST

Jesus called John the greatest of all those who had preceded him: "I tell you, among those born of women, no one is greater than John..." But John would have agreed completely with what Jesus added: "Yet the least in the kingdom of God is greater than he" (Luke 7:28). John spent his time in the desert, an ascetic. He began to announce the coming of the kingdom and to call everyone to a fundamental reformation of and to call everyone to a fundamental reformation of life.

His purpose was to prepare the way for Jesus. His baptism, he said, was for repentance. But One would come who would baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire. John is not worthy even to carry his sandals. His attitude toward Jesus was: "He must increase; I must decrease" (John 3:30)

John was humbled to find among the crowd of sinners who came to be baptized the one whom he already knew to be the Messiah. "I need to be baptized by you" (Matthew 3:14b). But Jesus insisted, "Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness" (Matthew 3:15b).

Jesus, true and humble human as well as eternal God, was eager to do what was required of any good Jew. John thus publicly entered the community of those awaiting the Messiah. But making himself part of that community, he made it truly messianic. ©2013, Franciscan Media

WHO WAS FATHER MICHAEL MCGIVNEY?



The Founder of the Knights of Columbus was Father Michael J. McGivney, a Catholic priest who was declared Venerable (one step below Saint) by Pope Benedict XVI In 2008 and whose cause is under consideration by the Vatican's Congregation for the Causes of Saints.

The son of Irish immigrants parents who came to America during the famine of the 1840's, he was born in Connecticut and

grew up at the time when anti-Catholic prejudice greatly limited social and employment opportunities in the United States. From an early age, he wanted to become a priest. He was ordained in 1878 and his first assignment was at St. Mary's Catholic Church in New Haven, Connecticut.

It was at St. Mary's Church in early 1882 that he gathered together a group of layman from his parish and formed the Knights of Columbus. He had two goals for his new group. One was to provide assistance to widows and children when a family breadwinner died. He also provided Catholic men with a fraternal association that would grow them closer to their Catholic faith and one another. Father McGivney was an idealist. He was a man whose youthful vision and creativity expanded and matured even as physical well being diminished. There are now thousands of Knights of Columbus Councils throughout the world supporting charities and donating millions of dollars.

Locally, Council 13300 in fiscal year 2018 donated over \$38,000, supporting 21 + charities. They provided thousands of hours volunteering for a multiple of charitable causes.
