

ADULT FAITH FORMATION

THE UPPER ROOM

Scripture says that Mary and the disciples were gathered together in the Upper Room when the Holy Spirit descended upon them. It is the same room where the Last Supper was held (a belief held by scholars since the fourth century), and where the risen Christ appeared to the apostles.

Where was that Upper Room?

Where was that Upper Room? Also known as the Cenacle (which means "dining room"), Scripture scholars believe it was the second floor of a synagogue located on Mount Zion (a Byzantine church was later constructed on its remains). During the destruction of Jerusalem in 70 A.D., the room was spared any damage and soon became known as the Church of the Apostles. That church was later torn down and replaced by a new church in 382, which itself was destroyed nearly 300 years later when the Persians invaded Jerusalem. Crusaders built the present church in the 12th century. The structure retains portions of the original walls. The first floor of the Cenacle is also believed to contain King David's burial Cenacle is also believed to contain King David's burial place.
