

#### **RESPONSORIAL PSALM**


The responsorial Psalm follows the silence after the first reading. Occasionally this is taken from other parts of the Scripture, but ordinarily it is from the Book of Psalms in the Old Testament. It is designed in the form of a dialogue. The cantor sings the antiphon and all repeat it. The verses are sung by the cantor, and after each verse, the antiphon is sung again by the assembly. Occasionally, for lack of a cantor, the psalm is recited instead of sung. However, the responsorial psalm should be sung. © 2008 Resource Publications, Inc.

### St. Benedict



It is unfortunate that no contemporary biography was written of a man who has exercised the greatest influence on monasticism in the West. Benedict was born of a distinguished with pagan armies on the march, the Church torn by

schism, people suffering from war, and morality at a low ebb.

Some monks chose him as their leader for a while, but found his strictness not to their taste. Still, the shift from hermit to community life had begun for him. He had an idea of gathering various families of monks into one "grand monastery" to give them the benefit of unity, fraternity, permanent worship in one house. Finally he began to build what was to become one of the most famous monasteries in the world-Monte Cassino, commanding three narrow valleys running toward the mountains north of Naples.

In the course of the Middle Ages, all monasticism in the West was brought under the Rule of St. Benedict. Today the Benedictine family is represented by two branches: the Benedictine Federation and the Cistercicians.

# WHY DO WE FINGERPRINT EVERY 5 YEARS?

In order to participate in our ministries, there is a requirement for Safety Training as well as fingerprinting. Many people have wondered why is it necessary to renew their fingerprints every five years.

The answer is that the FBI and the other agencies involved do not store the fingerprints that are sent to them for routine background records checks. The FBI will only keep fingerprints of people who have been arrested or work in certain high-security or highly sensitive areas.

The retention time of fingerprint records after background checks is only 5 years. Therefore, it is necessary for fingerprinting to be renewed for the continued protection of others and to keep a high level of diligence from the Parish.

Our Parish Food Pantry is currently serving over 350 families each month. On average, the Pantry serves over 25 new families every month. Please continue your generous food and monetary donations that make it possible for us to help the many people in our area who are in need of food.

**Food Pantry Requests** include the following: canned meats, pasta, side dishes, canned pasta w/meats, spaghetti sauce, pork & beans, pinto beans, canned fruit, canned tuna, canned vegetables, potatoes (canned or boxed,) cereal, soup, peanut butter, jelly, pasta, mac & cheese, corn muffin mix, cake mix, pancake mix, crackers, cookies, condiments, white rice, coffee, tea, paper products, cleaning supplies and toiletries. The Second Vatican Council in the Decree on the Church's Missionary Activity, Ad Gentes Divinitus states: "Since the whole Church is missionary, and the work of evangelization the fundamental task of the people of God, this sacred Synod invites all to undertake a profound interior renewal so that being vitally conscious of their responsibility for the spread of the Gospel they might play their part in missionary work among the nations" (no. 35).

This universal mandate to do missionary work is taken up directly by men and women, including clergy, religious and laity, serving as missionaries. However, other world missionary work does not exhaust the possibilities of missionary participation of all the people of God, and all baptized Catholics are called to support the missions as part of the body of Christ.
