


Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is normally celebrated December 8th. This date falls on Sunday this year, so the Feast day has been moved to Monday, December 9th and, thus is not a holy day of obligation this year. However, for those who wish to attend Mass, two will be offered on Monday, Dec. 9th: 8:00am at Saint Thomas Church and 7:00pm at St. Teresa Church.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments— Keeping God's Children Protected and Safe: To know that we are children of God is to live in complete love, with deep abiding security and the ability to dream, to sing, to create, to laugh, and to play without worry.
