#### DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Spring is here and lots of things are happening around the center. We are thrilled to have visitors return to lunch in person, this means however that there won't be as many grab & go events. We hope you'll consider joining us in person for some of our other great upcoming programs too. Also, don't forget to sign up for the Walk Massachusetts challenge. Town Meeting is scheduled for May 9 at 7:30 p.m. We will provide limited transportation for those who wish to attend. There are a several articles worth looking at, but one in particular is sponsored by the Council on Aging and Recreation Commission. We are seeking funding for a needs and site assessment to possibly build a multigenerational community center that would house both the senior center and recreation. With the space limitations for both our departments, we feel that the best use of resources is for us to explore existing town owned properties for the future site of a multigenerational community center. We invite you to watch our presentations to the Advisory and Select Boards for more details. Links to these meetings and our presentation can be found on our page under the Town of Norwell website. This is the first step in the process to determine if there is an interest and or need in the community, as well as identify any potential sites for a new facility. Based on the outcome of this review, next steps will include determining where this project falls in priority of the Town's capital plan, as well as identifying funding resources. We anticipate that a building project, if it comes to bear, would not happen for a few years. We appreciate your consideration and support.

In June, we will also begin a separate needs assessment process with the Center for Social & Demographic Research in Aging Gerontology Institute at UMass Boston. The purpose is to help us look at senior center services and programming both for today and in the future. It will also help us identify needs and barriers to aging in Norwell. This final report will be shared with Town leadership to help us develop a strategic plan to support older residents in the future. Surveys will be sent to residents age 50 and older in the upcoming months. We ask that you please take the time to complete

and return it to us. There will also be opportunities to participate in focus groups. Your input is very important and the more honest the responses, the better we can plan for future needs. This assessment is funded by a formula grant, provided by the Executive Office of Elder Affairs.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR MEDICARE RECIPIENTS – PLEASE READ

I've served as a Certified SHINE (Serving Health Insurance Needs of Everyone) Counselor since 2015, in my position as Outreach Coordinator.

This is a role that in many centers, is performed by a volunteer. We felt strongly that Medicare counseling should be part of our outreach efforts, which is why I originally became certified. I truly enjoy helping residents navigate their journey into Medicare. During consultations, I use SHINE approved information, as well as documents that have been developed by Peggy McDonough. Peggy is a highly respected, retired Regional SHINE Director, with over 30 years of experience in the SHINE program. She was the Director who trained me when I first became certified and continues to be my mentor.

Outside of formal SHINE meetings, I meet regularly with a group of other seasoned counselors, with Peggy as our guide. Together we discuss case studies, review Medicare documents, create informational documents and share best practices. We spend countless hours researching and reviewing information to ensure accuracy and to prepare documents that are user-friendly and easy to read for our counseling meetings.

Recently, all SHINE Counselors were notified that to remain certified, we can no longer use documents and charts that are not officially issued by SHINE. This means I can no longer use documents developed by Peggy or our team. Without them, I feel I cannot provide you with the best available information or the level of service that you deserve.

After great deliberation, COA Director Susan Curtin and I have decided that I will no longer be a Certified SHINE Counselor. I will, however, continue to assist Norwell residents on your Medicare journey as an Independent Medicare Counselor. Please be assured that I will continue to educate myself about Medicare changes, meet with a dedicated group of counselors to share best practices and information, and continue to provide unbiased information to help you make your decisions.

On a separate note, in March, I was recertified as a Certified Application Counselor with MassHealth. I look forward to continuing to serve those who seek assistance with navigating Medicare and MassHealth.

We provide transportation to medical appointments, grocery shopping and local prescription pick up. Please call the COA at 781-659-7878 for additional information or to schedule a ride.

- **Riders must schedule a minimum of three** (3) business days in advance. No Friday or weekend calls for Mondays.
- Our priority is medical appointments (doctor, PT and other procedures not involving sedation) and our service area includes Norwell, Hanover, Hingham, Weymouth, Cohasset, Scituate and some parts of Pembroke.
- Transportation is available Monday through Thursday for appointments with a start time between 9:00 a.m. and no later than 2:00 p.m. Appointments on Friday mornings between 9:00 and Noon, in Norwell and Hanover only.
- Riders MUST BE READY AT LEAST 15 • **MINUTES BEFORE DESIGNATED PICKUP TIME** at home. Our schedules are tight and drivers cannot wait.
- Be sure to ask your medical provider about their waiting policy before and after your appointment.
- We understand that things can come up last minute. If same-day transportation can be accommodated we will provide it, but it is not quaranteed.
- There is no fee for our transportation.
- Masks are strongly encouraged while riding on our vans.
- Due to liability issues, we do not provide transportation for hospital, nursing home or rehab discharge or procedures that require sedation. In certain cases, South Shore Community Action Council may be able to assist in this type of transportation. Please call us to inquire.

The building of the Casa Grande was a major event of the Classic Period (1100 - 1450 C.E.). The best dating



methods available indicate that this large, caliche structure was built during the 1300's. The construction appears to have been well planned and organized, requiring tons of material and a huge cooperative effort on the part of many people. Though many theories have been suggested, we still aren't sure as to its purpose. All we can assume is that the Casa Grande must have been very important to the people who built it. Join us as we learn about this fascinating mystery in Arizona!

#### Tues., June 28—Truman Presidential Library: The Upset of the Century

Truman's approval in 1948 was at an alltime low. Still, he enjoyed being President and threw himself into the challenge of his longshot reelection bid. His aggressive cross-country "Whistle Stop" campaign began nearly broke. Defec-



tions by southern "Dixiecrats" on the right and Henry Wallace supporters on the left endangered the party. Yet these setbacks only energized Truman. He predicted victory using his own electoral calculations. Traveling via train, he met with midwestern farmers and cheering crowds in Harlem in the last campaign where television did not play a role. His win over Thomas Dewey was one of the greatest upsets in U.S. political history.


