

The Pastor's Page

Dear Family in the Lord,

As we step into a new Church Year this weekend with the Season of Advent, I look back with tremendous gratitude over the past year! So much has happened. In so many ways the call to "go deeper" has been enthusiastically embraced by so many of you, and, as a result, we have seen renewed appreciation, new discovery, and fuller participation in the life of our community. Whether we look at outreach, ministries, faith formation, evangelization, expansion in diversity of ages of those involved, our Liturgical celebrations, or fellowship, we are a community going deeper, expanding our vision, and embracing a "future full of hope"! It's exciting and it's a blessing for me to be sharing this journey with you at this time in the life of our Catholic community, a community that has been seeking to discern the Lord's will and respond to His call as Catholic Christians for close to 169 years. Different times and needs have called for various responses made over time, and, as those who went before and sought to meet those changing and emerging needs, so we seek to do today, and seek the prayerful intercession of the holy men and women who have stepped out in faith before us! It's a unique blessing that, for all that changes, we have, in a way, remained "anchored" here on this hill ever since this land was purchased and the first little wooden church, then named "St Mary's," was erected on this land on the corner of Summer and Chatham Streets in 1851.



As we embrace this legacy, we, in the life, ministry, and physical facilities of our parish, continue to manifest the great truth and gift – that our Lord is not "far off and far away," but, indeed EMMANUEL – God with us! From that first feeding trough that became His dwelling, to our Church building today, His presence is with us and offers us a place of encounter, a sign of hope, and a visible reminder of the Word made flesh, dwelling among us! I am amazed and filled with gratitude at those who have come forward thus far, a little more than a month into our "Embrace" Hope" Capital Campaign, and, by their pledges and donations, have us more than three quarters of the way to our goal for the repurposing of this Holy Hill and the restoration of our beautiful Church.

As we live these days of Advent, let's be united in our efforts to prepare our hearts and souls, not just all the "stuff," for the celebration of the Lord's Nativity. As we go deeper into the mysteries and allow ourselves to be led deeper, we can live our faith in ways that are compelling, life giving, and contagious! I hope that the Reflection booklets, Sunday Evensong opportunity, Wednesday night Candlelight Mass, daily Morning Mass, daily Adoration opportunity, and use of Advent wreaths in homes and the wafers at Christmas dinner will all help us open ourselves more fully to the One who wants to renew his life within us! He came! He will come in glory. But, let us also be alert, awake, and on the watch, for the many ways He comes in mystery and in the ordinary stuff of our daily lives. Check out the "Advent Opportunities" page elsewhere in this bulletin. Carve out the time! If you are new to our parish, be sure to discover the beautiful tradition of Evensong on Sundays at 6:00 PM and also the Candlelight Mass at the high altar, in the style of the old Rorate Masses, accompanied by beautiful Gregorian chant of the season, on Wednesday nights at 7:00 PM.

Let's pray for one another, that we all might discover in ever deeper ways that He is indeed EMMANUEL—God with us!




Baptism of Children



Catholic Charities New Hampshire Acquires Program Serving At-Risk Veterans

Building on our commitment to serving the poor and vulnerable across New Hampshire, Catholic Charities NH has acquired Manchester-based Liberty House. Liberty House, which is now an official program of Catholic Charities, serves homeless and at-risk veterans through sober transitional housing, clothing and food distribution, and various mental and physical wellness programs. Many of these veterans face immense challenges and invisible wounds, such as trauma, addiction, and a lack of secure housing. It is our goal to expand on the work Liberty House has done for more than 15 years – and through your support – create more hope, independence and self-sufficiency for this extremely vulnerable and underserved population.

Advent Opportunities



This weekend we step into a new Church Year as we begin the Season of Advent. It's a season that can do so much for us if we carve out some space and embrace Advent living. But, for so many, the secularism around us can have it be all about pre-Christmas rush and all the "stuff." Here are some simple opportunities your parish family holds out to you to make it different this year!

ADVENT DAILY REFLECTION BOOKLETS are at the church entrances for your use to help you pause and reflect in these days, allowing the richness of the scriptures to create an intensified dwelling of Christ within you and your home. Take one!

ADVENT WREATH AT HOME is a wonderful way to bring the season into your home – the "domestic church." Flyers with a description and suggested prayers can be obtained at the church entry racks.

WEEKDAY MORNING MASS could be a great start and focus to your day to keep you grounded in the reason for the season! Holy Mass is offered at 8:00 AM Monday through Saturday.

CONFESSIONS are heard daily, Monday through Saturday, at 8:30 AM; Saturday afternoon at 3:00 PM; Sunday afternoon at 3:45 PM and again from 5:30 to 6:00 PM, and 6:30 to 7:00 PM (before and after Evensong, while Adoration is ongoing). Don't delay! Don't miss this *most important* of all Christmas preparations!

ADVENT EVENSONG & BENEDICTION takes place on Sundays, December 1, 8, 15, and 22 at 6:00 PM. A brief half hour in a candlelight setting, with reflection, intercession, and the beautiful anthems of the season. Restful, focused, and an opportunity to simply come before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and receive His blessing for our living of these days. (Please note that Adoration opportunity precedes at 5:30 PM and follows until 7:00 PM for those who want to linger, as well as Confession availability.)

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRA-MENT is possible daily in our church throughout Advent. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament takes place Monday through Saturday from 7:00 to 7:55 AM; Thursdays in addition from 8:30 AM to 5:00 PM; Sundays from 5:30 to 6:00 PM Evensong, then after Evensong until 7:00 PM. Sitting quietly before Him, experiencing Him as Emmanuel – God with us! Discover this awesome gift!

CANDLELIGHT EVENING MASS is offered **each Wednesday night at 7:00 PM**. This unique style of celebration, in the darkness, offered "ad orientem" at the high altar, and accompanied by the Gregorian chant of the ancient "Rorate Mass," is soul-stirring and a great mid-week way to keep focus!

Project Update

Demolition bids were all in as of November 19th. We'll review them, select a company, send it to the Diocese for approval, and then we can move forward with the demolition. Currently the liturgical designer is working on sketches of recommendations for church restoration. We will have gatherings to review and give input/ask questions, after study by our Design & Environment Committee. Watch for more! Things are on the move!

No payment need accompany it. For bookkeeping purposes, it helps if, once you have prayerfully discerned your sacrificial gift, you turn your card in. You will receive an acknowledgement letter of gratitude to confirm we have received/recorded it.


Benefactor/Memorial Listing


