Health Ministry: Need Sleep? Food NOT to Eat Before Bedtime

A bad night's sleep can lead us



to crave unhealthy snack/junk food the next day. A small snack before bed is OK but some food is likely to rob you of good sleep. Coffee, Chocolate (especially the dark) and Sodas (Coke, Pepsi, Mt. Dew, Red Bull) all contain caffeine, a stimulant, which stays in your system long after consumed. Spicy Foods containing cayenne, curry or peppers tend to increase blood flow which raises body temperature. For good sleep the body temperature should lower. High Fat **Foods** (burgers, pizza, bacon, cheese, anything fried) - more high fat = more acid production = greater chance of heart burn. Also add to this list of high fat content food: butter, ice cream, yogurt, nuts, and avocados. Pizza not only contains the high fat cheese, but is paired with acidic tomato sauce. Celery & Water - celery is a natural diuretic which quickly pushes water through your system leading you to the bathroom and not to bed; water - to stay hydrated drink sufficient amounts during the day or you may be visiting the bathroom throughout the night. Hungry near bedtime? Try a banana, kiwi, most berries or an apple, for all are healthy carbohydrates.

Introductions to Readings

First Reading - Jeremiah 33:14-16

The prophet Jeremiah lived at a difficult time in Jewish history. Jerusalem, their beloved capitol, had been destroyed, and most of the people taken captive to far-off Babylon, which is in present-day Iraq. Despite this gloomy setting, Jeremiah expresses the conviction that the Lord will raise up a new leader from the line of David to restore and rebuild their native land.

Second Reading - 1 Thessalonians 3:12-4:2

The date was some 30 years after Christ's death and resurrection. The place was a city in northeast Greece called Thessalonica, where Christians were being persecuted. Paul, who had brought the Gospel there, heard about their perseverance and sent a letter of encouragement.

use of purple, while providing a visual distinction
between the purple or red violet of Lent.

Answers to the Special Advent Faith Quiz

- 1. (d) Unlike the civil calendar year, the Church begins her liturgical calendar at the beginning of Advent.
- 2. (a) Sung since the 8th century, the "O Antiphons" proclaim Christ as the fulfillment of people's desire for a Savior. These antiphons form the basis for the Advent hymn, "O Come, O come, Emmanuel."
- 3. (b) Advent calendars use images of symbols, stories, and traditions of the season to teach about God sending his Son Jesus as our Savior and Redeemer.
- 4. (c) Each year during Advent, we reflect on the meaning of God choosing to become a human being and dwell with us. The Church teaches that "only when Christ is formed in us will the mystery of Christmas be fulfilled in us" (CCC, n. 526; see also n. 524).
- 5. (False) Advent is a season of joyful preparation for celebrating the coming of the Savior of the world. Advent is characterized by expectations and hope.
- 6. (False) The German people in the fifteenth century were the first to bring evergreen trees into their houses as a symbol of the everlasting life Jesus brought to all humankind.
- 7. (b) Light was a powerful symbol in a world without electricity, especially during winter when there were few daylight hours. Early Christians used light to represent Jesus overcoming the darkness of sin (see John 1:5;8-12). The four candles represent the four weeks of the Advent Season.




