Introductions to Sunday Readings

First Reading - Isaiah 9:1-6

The prophet Isaiah lived 750 years before Christ. In his time, the northern Jewish kingdom of Israel was laid waste by the armies of Assyria. Today's passage offers the conquered people hope for a glorious future under a wonderful king. Christians have seen Jesus as fulfilling this prophecy.

Second Reading - Titus 2:11-14

The letter to Titus was written about 30 years after Paul's death, and was written in Paul's name, a practice common in the ancient world. Titus was a traveling companion of Paul, and later was in charge of a Christian community on the island of Crete.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

We regularly receive phone calls asking Fr. Civille to give "Last Rites." Previously administered only to the dying or critically ill, the sacrament is known now as the Sacrament of the



Anointing of the Sick. Today the sacrament is extended to all who are ill or are about to undergo a surgery or treatment. Like the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist to which it is closely linked, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick can be repeated as often as necessary. There is no need nor reason to wait for the last possible second. You are encouraged to call the parish office 422-0602 if you would like to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for yourself or for a loved one.
