

First Reading - Acts 2:1-11



Pentecost was a Jewish feast that celebrated the beginning of the harvest. It took place 50 days after the feast of Passover. Jewish pilgrims came to Jerusalem from all over the ancient world for the celebrations of the feast. Today we hear how Pentecost became a Christian feast.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13
Paul's first letter to the Corinthians responds to a letter they wrote to him. They had asked him how to deal with the diversity of gifts in the community, and the rivalries and jealousies that inevitable arose. In today's passage, he uses a comparison that we will recognize immediately.

The church office received a phone call from a lady who had been referred to Holy Family for help. As she told her story it was apparent that she had a situation that she and her family could not handle alone. Her husband's 21-year-old sister had left Honduras on foot with her 3-year-old daughter heading for asylum in the U.S. The situation in her home country had gotten so bad that this was the only solution she could find. When she called her brother and sister-in-law, they of course told her they would sponsor her. The border security people processed both Lilliana and her daughter, gave them an asylum court hearing date of one and a half years from now, put an ankle bracelet on mom and got them to the airport for a flight to Cincinnati. Danielle and her husband were ready and willing to help, but it couldn't have come at a worse time. Danielle was on leave from her LPN job for medical reasons. An abscess on her tonsils had ruptured and she had sepsis to deal with. She was hospitalized because of the infection and the problems it could cause to her already existing heart issues. She had surgery, many tests and a short stay in the hospital which resulted in a \$7,500 bill after her health insurance had paid their part. Danielle and her husband have a small, neat little house that works well for their family of five, but adding two more is a challenge. SVDP was able to provide beds for mom and daughter as well as a Kroger gift card. We also will be helping with their utility bill for the next two months until Danielle goes back to work. The food pantry provided bags of food to the family and stand ready to help again. The little girl needed both medical and dental attention and both of those services were provided by members of our parish. Our resourceful ladies in the church office provided a special milk formula that the girl drinks, diapers and a grocery card. They also contacted Catholic Charities and applied for help for Lilliana with the Su Casa program. A caseworker will be assigned and they will follow her through this long process of gaining asylum. We should all be proud of this wonderful team of caring people we have at Holy Family Parish. Both employees and volunteers are ready to step up to help the less fortunate, just as Jesus has asked of all of us.



END OF YEAR AWARDS

The McConnell family once again generously funded the money for us to give out the **Vivian McConnell Volunteerism Award**. This award is given to a current 7th grade student or students and provides up to \$1,000 towards their 8th grade tuition to St. John XXIII Catholic School.

Vivian McConnell is the mother of eight children, all of whom attended Catholic School, and was widowed at the young age of 44. Even as a single parent, with very little time to herself, she always volunteered. She was a Girl Scout and Cub Scout leader, gave her time to the cafeteria at school, and ran the Holy Trinity Church and John XXIII School Bingo for almost 30 years which allowed us to keep tuition costs at a minimum. When at the age of 78, Vivian felt she could no longer devote the time and effort it took to run Bingo, this program ended at our school and parish.

All 7th grade students are required to compose an essay on volunteerism. These essays are then "blindly" scored by a committee of teachers so the writers are not identifiable. While there were many, many thought provoking and inspiring essays, this year one essay stood out above all of the others.


