Do You Need a Break from the "Noise?"

The "noise" is anything that disrupts your primary focus, which originates from the outside world. You may be unsuccessfully trying to read



a book or you could be awake at night, thinking about back-to-school plans, pending work, the state of the world... Modern life overburdens us with more "to dos" and communicates to us the need for a packed schedule, and it also offers more to distract us.

During the pandemic, the pressure "to do" and the distraction from doing has worsened. Without distinction between work and home, days of the week and times of the day, we are not only disoriented, but also are more likely to work longer and more prone to distraction.

How do you cultivate silence in your life?

Here are some ideas for creating a quieter day:

- Introduce morning and bedtime mindfulness meditation, journaling, breathing exercises.
- Monitor and reduce hours on social media.
- Monitor and reduce news consumption.
- Take regular breaks, including lunch.
- Go for walks and/or exercise alone.
- Choose noise-cancelling headphones or white noise, if you are sensitive to sound.

In the past, students previously enrolled were automatically advanced to the next grade level and I'll follow that process this year. But I will need to know if any of those students won't be participating this year and if there are any other students to be added.

Introductions to Sunday Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor



First Reading - Isaiah 22:19-23

In Jerusalem eight centuries before Christ, God spoke through the Prophet Isaiah who is told to address a problem. The "master of the palace" — the equivalent of a secretary of state — was a man named Shebna. God says that he is to be demoted because he used this office for his own advantage. We will hear a description of the investiture of Shebna's successor, Eliakim.

Second Reading - Romans 11:33-36

Today's reading concludes a part of Paul's letter to the Romans in which he agonizes over the fate of Jewish people who have not accepted Christ. Paul simply leaves the matter in God's hands, and closes with a hymn that talks of the mysterious ways of Divine Providence. You will notice that the ending of this hymn is similar to the way we end every Eucharistic prayer.


