 Only buy what you need, so everyone in your community can get what they need.

• If your employer allows you to gift your sick time, donate some to a coworker who needs to be off to care for themselves or family.

• Be extra kind to medical staff and those working in grocery stores and in food delivery.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew
