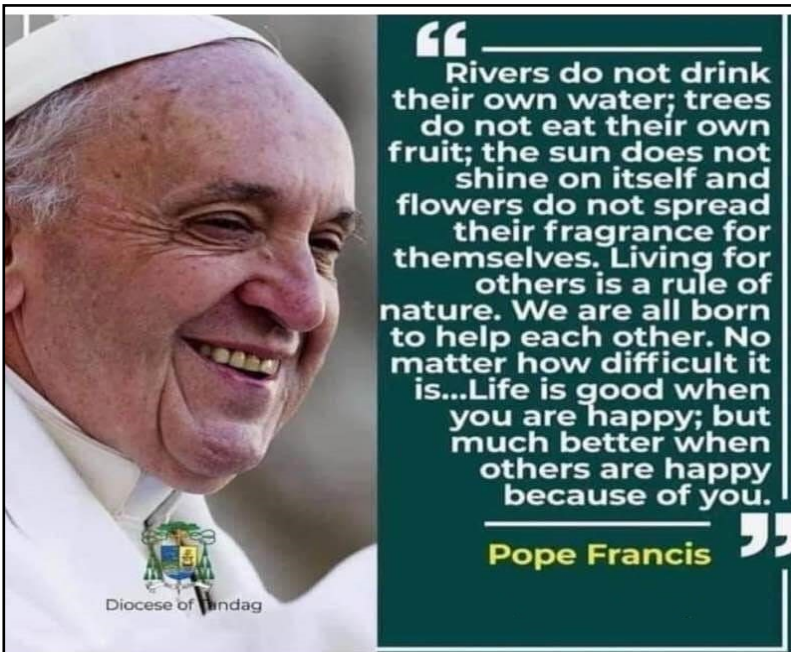

Simple Ways to Help Others During the COVID-19 Pandemic



The best and easiest ways to help others at this time is to **wash your hands**, **social distance** when out, and **self-quarantine** if you're sick or think you've been exposed to COVID-19. For most of us, self-isolating is a challenge, but **all this distance from one another doesn't make us helpless**. Whether you have time, money, a car or even a phone, there are big and small ways to help others.

- Schedule regular chats by phone with homebound individuals. Call a friend or relative who's far away and lives alone. Reach out to them, let them hear your voice, listen to them and make sure they're doing ok.
- Shop or do errands for quarantined families who need to stay home or don't want to take their kids out in public areas.
- Only buy what you need, so everyone in your community can get what they need.
- If your employer allows you to gift your sick time, donate some to a coworker who needs to be off to care for themselves or family.
- Be extra kind to medical staff and those working in grocery stores and in food delivery.
- Have dinner delivered from a great local restaurant to the health care professionals, seniors or quarantined families on your block.
