

Introductions to Sunday Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor



First Reading - Isaiah 45:1, 4-6

When today's passage from the book of Isaiah was written, the Jewish people had been held in exile in Babylon for more than 40 years. Cyrus, the king of neighboring Persia, was preparing to invade Babylon. The prophet sees Cyrus, a pagan king, as an instrument of God. Through his military victory, God will free his people and allow them to return home.

Second Reading - 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5 Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians is the earliest of all New Testament writings, coming only about 20 years after the Resurrection of Jesus. Today's reading gives us the letter's opening words. In just five verses we hear reference to God the Father, the Lord Jesus and the Holy Spirit, and also to faith, hope and love. It indicates how quickly these essentials of our faith became part of our Christian tradition.

Holy Family Parish St. Vincent de Paul Society - Report of Activities for 2019 - 2020

The following attempts to summarize the various activities provided by your SVDP Conference for our Middletown Community. These are made possible through the volunteer efforts of your fellow parishioners and your generous support. As you might expect, the Covid 19 virus had significant impact on many of our ministries and we expect this will expand in the months ahead. Financially, we finished our fiscal year with a positive monetary balance but we expect ever increasing demands as the virus wears on. As an example, we have undertaken to provide rent assistance where possible. Demands on this will increase as unemployment continues and foreclosures expand... only time will tell. OUTREACH

The virus caused us to significantly curtail this program. For the most part, we have decided to make this reduction permanent providing only beds and mattresses in the future. We will purchase items locally but will no longer pick up donations of furniture. The virus, of course, had its affect on our willingness to enter homes but we also lost our storage space at Hook Airport.

Additionally, we recognized the age of our volunteers dictated we make the curtailment decision.

In 2019 we made 203 home visits to assess client needs and 253 home deliveries. This year 113 home visits were made with 108 deliveries.

HELP LINE

432 requests for help with water and/or utility bills were addressed by this group of volunteers. We don't have the family members breakdown but a conservative estimate would place the number served in excess of 1,000 of our neighbors. In addition to providing financial help, this group also offers counseling as to available services through other agencies.

PANTRY

1,512 families were served. This represents an increase of 167 families compared to 2019. In addition, 110 families received groceries for Thanksgiving and Christmas (55 each holiday). All totaled 4,209 members of our community participated in the Pantry program plus the holiday count. Almost three tons of goods were purchased... 35,312 pounds to be exact. As in the past, Needler's Grocery continues to donate day-old baked goods five days a week. OTHER SERVICES

Infant Formula

The Community Pregnancy Center distributes baby formula for us which we purchase. In addition, they perform the prescreening and record keeping functions.

Jean Platt serves as coordinator, including purchase, pick up and delivery. This year we provided 70 containers. This represents a significant reduction from the 170 in 2018/2019.

Back Pack

Mike Wade and **John Lyons** deliver lunches provided by Family Services. This activity was suspended in March with the school closings. We anticipate its resumption in November.

Prison Ministry

This activity has been suspended as a result of the virus. **Mike Kelley** provides leadership by conducting spiritual services for inmates of the Middletown and Butler County jails.

Support

Tom Hackett provides us with financial counseling and grant request preparation. **Janet Zappia** provides donation acknowledgment and other functions. **Note: Many volunteers serve more than one ministry.**

CONCLUSION

Our operating expenses amounted to \$80,514 — a decrease of \$20,000 from last year. Your generous 5th Sunday donations covered about half of this (\$40,690). The balance of our revenue is received via grants from the Middletown Community Foundation, Barnitz Fund, McGraw Kokosing employees and individual sources. We are currently in a relatively good financial position and continue to search for ways to serve the needy citizens of our community.
