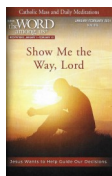

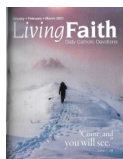

First Reading - Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14

The book of Sirach was written by a wise teacher who lived 200 years before Christ. Sirach ran a school for young people in Jerusalem. In today's passage, he advises his students on the proper way to honor their parents.

Second Reading - Colossians 3:12-17

The letter to the Colossians was written around the year 80 A.D. A major concern in this letter is how the Christian community appears to outsiders. The author offers guidelines so that Christian families will live in such a way that others will notice the difference.

First Reading - Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14

God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons. Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and preserves himself from them. And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

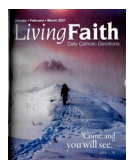

As you may well know, family caregivers are constantly making sacrifices because to caregive is to love... and to love is to make sacrifices for one's loved one. That's why the following 10 New Year's resolutions may help you be a better caregiver without making your life harder.

1. Don't beat yourself up because you aren't "perfect" at caregiving.
2. Remember that if you can't take a big break, little breaks help, too!
3. Tell other family members that you're not mad at them. It's just that, "I've used up all my nice." Tell them what you want: alone time, a hug, chocolate....
4. Don't hesitate to ask for - or even demand - help.
5. Forgive yourself for the times you have lost your temper.
6. Enjoy, relish the joyful moments with your care receiver!
7. Admit that what you are doing is difficult. It is!
8. Remember that your older loved one's condition may become worse, that he or she may die, but it isn't your fault.
9. Pray. Yelling at... speaking loudly at God can be a prayer that comes straight from the heart.
10. Know that you are not alone, even though at times you feel lonely. God has asked you to do this and you have accepted His invitation. He is with you always. Right here. Right now.
