

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity affords us the opportunity to reflect on the oneness of the divine permeating and pulsating through all creation, filling Earth's creatures with fecundity, beauty, wonder and the marvelous capacity to relate, to love.

Using traditional terms for the Trinity, 14th-century Dominican mystic Meister Eckhart once wrote: "Do you want to know what goes on in the core of the Trinity? I will tell you. In the core of the Trinity, the Father laughs and gives birth to the Son. The Son laughs back at the Father and gives birth to the Spirit. The whole Trinity laughs and gives birth to us." Julian of Norwich, a contemporary of Eckhart, offers us a hopeful word in relation to her understanding of Trinity: "Just as the joyful Trinity created all things out of nothing, so also the same blessed Trinity will make well all that is not well."

Update Liturgical Guidance - Worshipping Together Safely

Archbishop Dennis M. Schnurr has decreed that for the faithful of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day Mass is reinstated with the Sunday Masses of June 6, 2021 (including the vigil anticipatory Mass on Saturday, June 5). In addition, since our guidance throughout this pandemic has been to follow the regulations of public health authorities, with regards to masks/face coverings, the archdiocese will follow the public health orders given by the State of Ohio - Governor DeWine Statement on New CDC Mask Guidance on May 14, 2021:

"Ohio will be amending our remaining health orders to comply with the new CDC guidance, which says that those who have been vaccinated no longer need to wear masks, while those who have not been vaccinated should still wear a mask and socially distance."
