

Introductions to Sunday Readings

by Bishop Ken Untener, in collaboration with Catherine Haven and Fr. Bill Taylor First Reading - Ezekiel 2:2-5



Our first Scripture reading describes the call of the prophet Ezekiel. He was a Jewish priest who was deported to Babylon at the time of the exile. He is called to proclaim God's word to those who are exiled with him. God warns him that this will be no easy task.

Second Reading - 2 Corinthians 12:7-10 In the passage just preceding today's reading from Paul's letter to the Corinthians, he described some of his spiritual visions and revelations. But in today's passage, he chooses not to boast of these, but rather to talk about how God has worked through him despite his weaknesses.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

We sometimes receive phone calls asking Fr. Civille to give "Last Rites." Previously administered only to the dying or critically ill, the sacrament is



known now as the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Today the sacrament is extended to all who are ill or are about to undergo an operation or treatment. Like the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist, to which it is closely linked, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick can be repeated as often as necessary. There is no need nor reason to wait for the last possible moment. You're encouraged to call the parish office 422-0602 if you would like to receive the Anointing of the Sick for yourself or a loved one.
