SCAM Alert!! We're getting reports from parishioners regarding telephone scams.

These scams obviously are convincing, but be vigilant! **How can you tell it's a scam?**

✓ if they ask for money ✓ if they ask for gift cards ✓ if they ask for personal information such as your social security number, bank account number, or credit card number. **Get off the phone as soon as possible by saying you're looking up the information then "accidentally" hang up.** If you're told a family member is in trouble, begging you not to tell anyone else, use the same 'accidental' hang up technique then check in with another family member. You don't even have to mention the trouble stated in the call - just ask how they're doing, what they're up to, when you might get to see them... You'll find out in no time that there's no emergency. **The best option is to do what may seem rude to you - JUST HANG UP. These people are skilled at playing on your courtesy and keeping you talking.**

First Reading - Revelation 11:19, 12:1-6, 10

The book of Revelation was written about 95 A.D. to encourage people who were suffering persecution. It is written in symbolic language and uses many images — for example, a dragon to represent evil. In today's reading, the Church is depicted as a woman giving birth to the Messiah. As the years went by, this imagery was extended to Mary.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 15:20-27

In his first letter to the Corinthians, Paul addresses problems his converts in the community were experiencing. Some members of the community had questioned the bodily resurrection of Jesus, and their own resurrection as well. This passage is Paul's response.

Matthew 25: Ministries Pill Bottle Donations

Matthew 25: Ministries accepts donations of empty plastic pill bottles for inclusion in shipments of medical supplies and for shredding and recycling. The pill bottle program fulfills the dual needs of improving medical care in developing countries and caring for our environment. Acceptable collection items include:

- Prescription and over-the-counter pill bottles
- Large and small pill bottles
- Pill Bottles with and without secure caps

Pill bottles that are not appropriate to include with shipments of medical supplies are recycled and may generate revenue that supports Matthew 25: Ministries' programs. **If you wish to prepare bottles for shipment rather than recycling, please adhere to the following guidelines:**

- Bottles included in shipments of medical supplies must have an all plastic lid.
- Sort bottles by color and type.
- Remove labels, leaving no glue or residue.
- Wash bottles in very hot water and dish soap.
- Rinse and dry thoroughly.
- Replace lids on clean, dried bottles.
- Place clean, recapped bottles in large Ziploc bags marked **"Clean Bottles."** These will be blended with medical supplies.

1. (c) St. Thomas (1226-1274) was canonized in 1323 and declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius V. A Dominican friar and a university professor, Aquinas wrote the *Summa Theologica*, a summary of theology. His feast day is January 28.
2. (c) The Poor Clare Sisters were started by St. Clare of Assisi (1194-1253). They live in an enclosed monastery, embracing a life of community, contemplation, poverty, and joy.
