Health Ministry:

Six Science-Based Reasons Why Laughter Is The Best Medicine

Intuitively we know that laughter is one of the best tools we have for dealing with stress, and science backs that up. Below are six findings that should keep us wanting to laugh it up.

1) Laughter is a potent endorphin releaser.

Laughing with others releases endorphins in the brain — our homegrown feel-good chemicals.

2) Laughter contagiously forms social bonds.

The endorphin effect described above also explains why social laughter is so contagious. Spreading endorphin release through groups promotes a sense of togetherness and safety.

3) Laughter fosters brain connectivity.

When we hear a laugh, our brains work to decipher what sort of communication is coming through, as not all laughter is equal.

4) Laughter is central to relationships.

Couples who laugh together report better relationships.

5) Laughter has an effect similar to anti-depressants.

Laughing activates the release of the neurotransmitter serotonin, the same brain chemical affected by the most common types of antidepressants.

6) Laughter protects your heart.

Research has shown that laughter has an anti-inflammatory effect that protects blood vessels and heart muscles from damaging effects of cardiovascular disease. **Check out the last page!**

Introductions to Sunday Readings

First Reading - Isaiah 35:4-7

This section of the book of Isaiah contains the words of a prophet to God's people exiled in Babylon. He encourages them that one day they will be free to return home to Jerusalem. This journey will be through the desert, but God will transform this barren wasteland in order to ease their passage home.

Second Reading - James 2:1-5

The letter of James was written approximately 50 years after the death and resurrection of Jesus. It was addressed not to a particular community, but to Christians everywhere. Because of this, it is part of a group of New Testament letters called *catholic epistles* - meaning that the author wrote them for all Christians. One of the trademarks of the epistle of James is the need to *act* on God's word, not just *listen* to it.




Holy Family Parishioners Invited to Help Fr. Derek's Holy Family Hospital

We first met Fr. Derick in 2013 while he was in the US studying Health Management to better serve his dioceses in Ghana, West Africa. We've been lucky to have Fr. Derick return for visits the past several years, including a Lent Talk he gave in 2015 which featured his book *Your Uniqueness - Discovering Who You*, and for weekends in 2016 and 2018. Fr. Derick is currently the Hospital Administrator of Holy Family Hospital in Nkawkaw, Ghana and he's here to talk about the construction of the male and female wards.

According to Fr. Derick, the current blocks designated as male and female wards were old classrooms that were converted into wards about sixty years ago by the Missionary Sisters Servants of the Holy Spirit (SSpS) after establishing the facility in 1949. The hospital which serves as a referral center receives cases from the nearby hospitals/clinics and this sometimes stretches the admission capacity. It gets to a point where patients who are to be transited to the ward from the Emergency spend days at the Emergency because the wards are full. **Currently the bed capacity of the ward is 70. The proposed block will increase the capacity to 200 with a Physiotherapy Unit, Intensive Care Unit and a Stroke Unit.** Help is thus being solicited in terms of money or medical equipment to execute the project.
