

Beacons of Light, the archdiocese-wide pastoral planning process currently underway, will result in all parishes being grouped into "Families" under the leadership of one pastor. A draft of this plan will be shared for public comment October 1-20 at <a href="https://www.BeaconsAOC.org">www.BeaconsAOC.org</a>. Don't miss this opportunity to provide your input to this important initiative which will shape the future of our archdiocese.

#### When will the Families of Parishes be Finalized and Announced?

After the conclusion of the public comment period on October 20, all of the input provided by priests, deacons, school leaders and lay faithful will be considered in order to finalize the Families of Parishes. The recommended Families of Parishes will then be presented to Archbishop Schnurr by those who have guided the Beacons of Light process. The final recommendation will be the product of more than eight months of consultative work and numerous iterations. Upon the approval of the Families of Parishes the plan will be announced. The announcement is expected by the end of November.




