Sacrament of Confirmation for 8th Graders

The Sacrament of Confirmation is offered to 8th graders in our Archdiocese. These parishioners are already "initiated" into the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist, but with Confirmation they become "fully initiated" – a full-fledged member of the Church. With COVID restrictions, we have to adjust our usual procedures, so to begin this journey toward Confirmation, instead of conducting the Rite of Enrollment at a Sunday 10:30 AM Mass, Fr. Civile will do so at St. John Church on Monday, February 8th at 6:30 PM with only the 8th graders and their families in attendance.

While the parish as a whole cannot participate in the Rite of Enrollment, we can keep the 8th graders and their sponsors and families in our prayers.

The Book of Jonah is only two pages long and tells a parable about a man called by God to preach repentance to the pagan city of Nineveh. Jonah's first response was to sail as fast as he could in the other direction. After his adventures with a large fish, God called him a second time.

Today's passage picks it up from there.

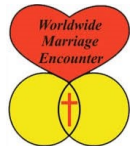
Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 7:29-31

Jonah began his journey through the city, and had gone but a single day's walk announcing, "Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed," when the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth. When God saw by their actions how they turned from their evil way, he repented of the evil that he had threatened to do to them; he did not carry it out.
