

Answers to the Special PRAYER Quiz

- 1. (d) Music is a priceless treasure in the Church. The Scriptures include praise and worship songs that date back to the days of Moses and King David (see CCC 1156-8).
- 2. (c) Catholics pray the Act of Contrition after they confess their sins in the sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation
- 3. (b) The Rosary was revealed in 1208 to St. Dominic by the Blessed Virgin Mary. Dominic's preaching conversion to heretics was greatly aided by this powerful prayer. In time, "Medieval piety ... developed the prayer of the rosary as a popular substitute for the Liturgy of the Hours" (CCC 2678). Thus the Rosary served as a popular prayer for illiterate Catholics of the day who couldn't pray with the psalms like the monks.
- 4. (d) "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:16-17).
- 5. (c) Many Protestant denominations pray the Our Father, as they rely exclusively on the Bible for their traditions, because all the Gospels describe how Jesus taught the Our Father to his disciples.
- 6. (b) Distractions show us what occupies our hearts and minds. These distractions make clear what we need to let go of so that God can be number one in our hearts. We cannot serve two masters (see CCC 2729).
- 7. (a) God wants us to talk to him, but he also wants to speak to us so we know how much he loves us.
