

First Reading - Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8

The book of Deuteronomy contains a lengthy farewell speech of Moses as the people prepared to enter the Promised Land. Moses makes it clear that they are expected to remain faithful to the Lord after they have settled in their new land.

Second Reading - James 1:17-18, 21-22, 27

Today and for the next four Sundays, we will read passages from the letter of James. Two points will be helpful background to today's passage. First: In the Jewish law, the first fruits of the harvest are given to God. This expresses the truth that the whole harvest ultimately belongs to God. Second: In the Old Testament, widows and orphans were classic examples of poor and defenseless people.

- Bottles included in shipments of medical supplies must have an all plastic lid.
- Sort bottles by color and type.
- Remove labels, leaving no glue or residue.
- Wash bottles in very hot water and dish soap.
- Rinse and dry thoroughly.
- Replace lids on clean, dried bottles.
- Place clean, recapped bottles in large Ziploc bags marked "Clean Bottles." These will be blended with medical supplies.

SCAM Alert!! We're getting reports from parishioners regarding telephone scams. These scams obviously are convincing, but be vigilant! How can you tell it's a scam?

✓ if they ask for money ✓ if they ask for gift cards ✓ if they ask for personal information such as your social security number, bank account number, or credit card number. Get off the phone as soon as possible by saying you're looking up the information then "accidentally" hang up. If you're told a family member is in trouble, begging you not to tell anyone else, use the same 'accidental' hang up technique then check in with another family member. You don't even have to mention the trouble stated in the call - just ask how they're doing, what they're up to, when you might get to see them... You'll find out in no time that there's no emergency. The best option is to do what may seem rude to you - JUST HANG UP. These people are skilled at playing on your courtesy and keeping you talking.
