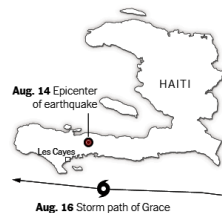

Special Collection for Haiti

A 7.2 magnitude earthquake that rocked Haiti on August 14th has left thousands injured and many more have lost their homes and loved ones. Then on the following Tuesday, Tropical Storm Grace hit Haiti. That day Catholic Relief Services (CRS) distributed tents to 194 families in Les Cayes before Grace arrived. The next day tarps, hygiene and kitchen kits, and metal sheets were delivered by CRS to 180 affected families in Les Cayes. Families in Haiti face tragedy from these devastating events. CRS is on the ground, in the places most heavily hit in Les Cayes and Jeremie, working with partners and affected communities to identify most urgent needs. Food is in short supply as stores and stocks have been destroyed and a landslide has blocked access.

Your gift will help provide essential relief, likely to include clean water, sanitation, shelter and emergency supplies, giving immediate aid to families affected. Thank you for all your support and prayers for affected communities in Haiti.

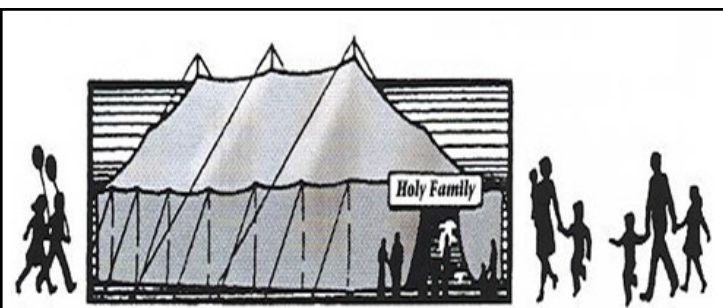


First Reading - Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8

The book of Deuteronomy contains a lengthy farewell speech of Moses as the people prepared to enter the Promised Land. Moses makes it clear that they are expected to remain faithful to the Lord after they have settled in their new land.

Second Reading - James 1:17-18, 21-22, 27

Today and for the next four Sundays, we will read passages from the letter of James. Two points will be helpful background to today's passage. First: In the Jewish law, the first fruits of the harvest are given to God. This expresses the truth that the whole harvest ultimately belongs to God. Second: In the Old Testament, widows and orphans were classic examples of poor and defenseless people.

Matthew 25: Ministries Pill Bottle Donations

Matthew 25: Ministries accepts donations of empty plastic pill bottles for inclusion in shipments of medical supplies and for shredding and recycling. The pill bottle program fulfills the dual needs of improving medical care in developing countries and caring for our environment. Acceptable collection items include:

- Prescription and over-the-counter pill bottles
- Large and small pill bottles
- Pill Bottles with and without secure caps

Pill bottles that are not appropriate to include with shipments of medical supplies are recycled and may generate revenue that supports Matthew 25: Ministries' programs. **If you wish to prepare bottles for shipment rather than recycling, please adhere to the following guidelines:**

- Bottles included in shipments of medical supplies must have an all plastic lid.
- Sort bottles by color and type.
- Remove labels, leaving no glue or residue.
- Wash bottles in very hot water and dish soap.
- Rinse and dry thoroughly.
- Replace lids on clean, dried bottles.
- Place clean, recapped bottles in large Ziploc bags marked **"Clean Bottles."** These will be blended with medical supplies.

SCAM Alert!! We're getting reports from parishioners regarding telephone scams.

These scams obviously are convincing, but be vigilant! **How can you tell it's a scam?**



✓ if they ask for money ✓ if they ask for gift cards ✓ if they ask for personal information such as your social security number, bank account number, or credit card number. **Get off the phone as soon as possible by saying you're looking up the information then "accidentally" hang up.** If you're told a family member is in trouble, begging you not to tell anyone else, use the same 'accidental' hang up technique then check in with another family member. You don't even have to mention the trouble stated in the call - just ask how they're doing, what they're up to, when you might get to see them... You'll find out in no time that there's no emergency. **The best option is to do what may seem rude to you - JUST HANG UP. These people are skilled at playing on your courtesy and keeping you talking.**
