A draft of this plan will be shared for public comment October 1-20 at <u>www.BeaconsAOC.org</u>. Don't miss this opportunity to provide your input to this important initiative which will shape the future of our archdiocese.

When will the Families of Parishes be Finalized and Announced?

After the conclusion of the public comment period on October 20, all of the input provided by priests, deacons, school leaders and lay faithful will be considered in order to finalize the Families of Parishes. The recommended Families of Parishes will then be presented to Archbishop Schnurr by those who have guided the Beacons of Light process. The final recommendation will be the product of more than eight months of consultative work and numerous iterations. Upon the approval of the Families of Parishes the plan will be announced. The announcement is expected by the end of November.



Answers to the Special ROSARY Faith Quiz

1. (c) The Apostle's Creed is an early statement of Christian belief that has been traced back at least as far as the fourth century AD. The Sign of the Cross is made while holding the Crucifix.

2. (d) While a decade does begin with an Our Father and concludes with a Glory Be, there are ten Hail Marys in between. The ten rosary beads for the decade are relatively close together with a single bead (that has open space to either side of it) between the decades.

3. (a) The Salve Regina (Hail, Holy Queen) and Litany of Loreto both focus on Mary and The Sign of the Cross is a blessing. The Prayer of St. Ephraim is used within the Eastern Orthodox church during the Great Lent. 4. (F) The rosary with 59 beads (including five decades) may be the most common, but it is not the only authorized version. Some rosaries (most commonly used by religious orders) contain 15 decades for the 15 mysteries. Rosary rings were sometimes used in the early modern period and had 10 indentations for a single decade. Other rosaries were designed to be easily hidden and were used in times and places where Catholic practices could not be freely followed. In addition, the beads themselves have been made from many

substances, ranging from plastic, to wood, to glass, to gold and jewels.

5. (d) The Luminous Mysteries: The Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan, The Wedding at Cana, Jesus Proclaiming the Kingdom of God, The Transfiguration, and The Institution of the Eucharist. Pope Pius V (1566-1572) established the first three Mysteries of the Rosary: The Joyous Mysteries: The Annunciation, The Visitation, The Nativity, The Presentation of Jesus at the Temple, and The Finding of Jesus in the Temple.

The Glorious Mysteries: The Resurrection, The Ascension, The Descent of the Holy Spirit, The Assumption of Mary, and The Coronation of the Virgin. The Sorrowful Mysteries: The Agony in the Garden, The Scourging at the Pillar, The Crowning with Thorns, The Carrying of the Cross, and The Crucifixion and Death of Jesus. 6. (a) The most common length of Novenas are nine days. A longer form of Novena is the 54-day Novena where the petition is offered for 27 days (three times nine) and thanksgiving is offered for 27 further days.
