

Falls - the Unfortunate Action.



Falling is the second leading cause of accidental death world wide and a major cause of injury, especially for the elderly. One in three adults, 65 years or older, falls each year. Even if there is no injury, one is often left with the fear of falling again, which cuts down on everyday activities causing one to become weaker, which increases the chance of falling again.

#### Conditions that contribute to falling:


Lower body weakness, vitamin D deficiency, difficulty walking, some medications, vision problems, foot pain or poor footwear, and home hazards. Most falls occur in: bathroom (36%), bedroom (21%), kitchen (15%), and living room (6%). **Fall prevention:** 

- \* Talk with your doctor to evaluate your risk.
- \* Do strength and balance exercises.
- \* Have your vision checked regularly.
- \* Make your home safer...increase light, get rid of clutter and rugs, install grab rails in bathrooms, place railings on both sides of stairs and avoid walking around your house wearing socks or slippery house shoes. CDC/Medscape/Hearthside


