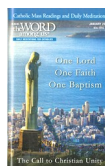

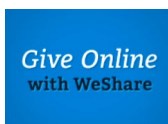

## Introductions to Sunday Readings

### First Reading - Isaiah 60:1-6

The last part of the book of Isaiah contains the words of a prophet who lived after the Jews returned from exile in Babylon (which is modern-day Iraq). They found their temple destroyed and the city leveled. But with great faith the prophet envisions a wonderful future for Jerusalem.

### Second Reading - Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6

The Ephesians were a community in which Jewish converts to Christianity lived side-by-side with Gentile converts. The author of this letter confirms that God's saving grace is available to everyone, whatever their background.

To start, he is asking for all dioceses throughout the world to conduct local meetings to discuss this very topic. Who are the People of God? It is all the baptized. ### **Forms of Tuition Assistance Available for St. John XXIII Catholic School**

**EdChoice Scholarship** – a state scholarship that covers tuition in its entirety. Must live in a failing public school area; there are several in Middletown.

**EdChoice Expansion** – a state scholarship that covers tuition in its entirety. Family must show proof of income that is 200% below the poverty line.

**Jon Peterson Scholarship** – available to students who have been identified as needing special services and who have a current IEP.

**Autism Scholarship** – available to students who have been identified with autism and who have a current IEP.

**Falcon Scholarship** – available to all families who apply. May NOT be combined with either of the EdChoice or the Jon Peterson Scholarships, or the Autism Scholarship.

**Holy Family Parishioner Scholarship** – available to those families who are current and active members of Holy Family Parish. May NOT be combined with either of the EdChoice, the Jon Peterson, or the Autism Scholarships.

**The Catholic Education Foundation Scholarship** – available through the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

The deadline is February 6, 2022. May NOT be combined with either of the EdChoice Scholarships, the Jon Peterson or the Autism Scholarships.

## 10 Practical New Year's Resolutions for Family Caregivers

As you may well know, family caregivers are constantly making sacrifices because to caregive is to love... and to love is to make sacrifices for one's loved one. That's why the following 10 New Year's resolutions may help you be a better caregiver without making your life harder.



1. Don't beat yourself up because you aren't "perfect" at caregiving.
2. Remember that even if you cannot take a big break, little breaks help, too.
3. Tell other family members that you're not mad at them. It's just that, "I've used up all my nice."  
Tell them what you want: alone time, a hug, chocolate....
4. Don't hesitate to ask for - or even demand - help.
5. Forgive yourself for the times you have lost your temper.
6. Enjoy and relish the joyful moments with your care receiver!
7. Admit that what you are doing is difficult. It is!
8. Remember that your older loved one's condition may become worse, that he or she may die, but it is *not* your fault.
9. Pray. Yelling at... speaking loudly at God can be a prayer that comes straight from the heart.
10. Know that you are not alone, even though at times you feel lonely. God has asked you to do this and you have accepted His invitation. He is with you always. Right here. Right now.

## EPIPHANY QUIZ ANSWERS

1. (c) The tradition that there were three arises from the three gifts that were given to the Holy Family.
2. (a) Quirinius was the Roman governor of Syria. Caesar Augustus was the chief of the Roman state. Flavius Joseph was the Jewish historian who chronicled Herod's reign.
3. (d) The Rev. John H. Hopkins, an Episcopal priest, wrote the text of this hymn in 1857 for a Christmas pageant at the General Theological Seminary in New York City. Phillips Brooks, also an Episcopal priest, wrote the text to "O Little Town of Bethlehem" in 1865. Father Josef Mohr wrote the text to "Stille Nacht" ("Silent Night") in 1816. Charles Wesley, the brother of John Wesley, wrote the text to "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" in (about) 1739.
4. (a) Luke jumps from the Nativity to when Jesus was twelve years old. Mark begins his Gospel with John the Baptist and the baptism of Jesus. John begins before the creation of the earth and then recounts Jesus' adult ministry.
5. (d) The Greek components are *epi-* meaning "on" or "to" and *-phainein* meaning "to show."
6. (d) Huey, Dewey and Louie are Donald Duck's nephews. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego were the three young Hebrew men cast into the fiery furnace by King Nebuchadnezzar (Daniel 3:1-29). Peter, Paul and James are all apostles.
7. (c) Myrrh comes from the trees *Commiphora myrrha* and/or *Balsamodendron kua*. Merbromin or Mercurochrome was an antiseptic in the United States until it was banned in 1998 because of the fear of mercury poisoning. Fiddah is the Arabic word for silver. Nutmeg is of the species *Myristica fragrans*.
