I never thought gratitude journaling was for me. But as I moved through a quiet and lonely winter with pandemic-induced restrictions and social limitations, I knew I needed to do something new last January. So, I gave it a try. Every night I listed 5 good things that happened to me that day. When I began, I recorded only moments that I thought I should be grateful for. As I continued, I began to let go of these expectations and be honest about what parts of my day I truly did enjoy: feeling energized after a fitness class, having a fun conversation at work, laughing at breakfast with my brother. Not only was I more aware of joy in my day, I realized that peace was possible even through the unpleasant and mundane parts of it. Gratitude journaling has also deconstructed the myth that my worth derives from my accomplishments. While I may gain satisfaction from tangible accomplishments and praise, I've learned that the core joy comes from the actual act of working or serving itself. The gift of staying consistent with gratitude journaling is that I can reflect on what is and isn't bringing me joy. The ultimate goal of this practice is to become closer to God and recognize His work in my life.
