## FROM YOUR PASTOR

I HOPE THAT everyone had a great Thanksgiving Day and now our attention turns to the season of Advent. Of course, the rest of the world has already been diving into the Christmas Season with Christmas displays, shopping, sending Christmas cards and getting ready for Christmas gatherings. Because of that, Christmas Day can become an anti-climactic festival. We can better prepare ourselves for that great feast by celebrating the Advent Season. How do we do that when Christmas trappings surround us?

HAVING AN ADVENT wreath in our own homes and praying as a family can help us to do so, especially as we read about the prophetic figures that prepared the way for Christ. We can spend a little time with Isaiah the prophet, John the Baptist, the Angel Gabriel, the doubting Zachariah, the welcoming Elizabeth, the faithful and patient Joseph, and the watchful Mary. We can take a little time out of our busy schedules to pray and ask the Lord's love to be born again in our hearts. We can turn away from our sins, celebrate the Sacrament of Penance, and embrace the virtues of patience and peace. We can write our cards and send them with a prayer of blessing, petition or thanksgiving for our friends and relatives. We can put up a crib set, but wait until Christmas day to add the baby Jesus, as a reminder of how the prophets as well as Mary and Joseph had to wait for the coming of Christ.

THE ADVENT SEASON is also a time of hope for the coming of the Kingdom, expectation for the coming of Christ, patient watchfulness for signs of His coming, and joyful expectation of the Good News realized. It is good for us during this season to reflect on the virtues of patience, hope, joy, fidelity, kindness and peace which all emerge in our Advent readings. How do we carry these virtues in our lives?

WHILE THE TRAPPINGS of Christmas surround us, we can still keep the gift of the Advent Season alive in our prayer, Sunday worship and our weekly activities in anticipation of the great feast of Christmas.

## PRAYER QUILT MINISTRY

A CHILD SHALL Lead Them...these were the words that led the PQM to ask the Faith Formation office permission to visit the first grade classes to teach the children 'the why and how' we tie prayer quilts. We have been going into these classes for 6 years. Teams of 2 ministry members visit each class & explain in terms which they can understand the making of a quilt. "The bologna sandwich" layers aka fabric & batting and the hand sewing of thick threads into the layers to join the quilt. They practice tying on plates with shoe strings threaded through, much like the actual quilt. Since many of these 6 year olds do not yet read, we encourage them to recite a known prayer such as the 'Our Father' or say a simple blessing for the recipient. Once mastered, they lay their hands on a specially made quilt for this purpose and tie. Many of these children have brought their families to the table to demonstrate and encourage their parents to tie. We are gratified to see these children continue to tie as they have grown. When a child is a recipient of a quilt, we ask a similar aged student to help "present the quilt during the service" with a ministry member. We strive to include and educate all in our ministry mission.

## CHRISTMAS WAFERS

THE CHRISTMAS WAFER (Oplatek)

commemorates a custom many centuries old. It is a tradition among Polish, Slovak, and Lithuanian families, which has been adopted by many other ethnic groups.

#### THE TRADITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

AFTER GRACE IS said and before sitting down to the Christmas Eve (or Christmas Day) meal, all present share the wafer as a symbol of love, brotherhood, innocence, and Christ. The father (or oldest person present) breaks the wafer with his wife (or next oldest person) exchanging wishes for health and happiness. Then the Oplatek is broken with others, beginning with the oldest child, also sharing wishes for happiness, health and good fortune. When the wafer is accepted, a willingness to forgive and forget is expressed; when it is offered to another, a willingness to share is denoted.

TO HELP CONTINUE this beautiful tradition of love and peace of the Christmas season, we make Christmas Wafers (Oplatek) available after all Masses.\*

## **STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS**

FOR US AS Catholics, our liturgical year ended November 24th with the Feast of Our Lord Christ the King, and our new ecclesiastical year began December 1st with the First Sunday of Advent.

THE WORD "ADVENT" means "coming" or "coming toward." It has the same roots as the word "arrival." It is our time to prepare for the "coming" or "arrival" of the King – of Christmas.

ADVENT IS A time of waiting and expectation - a season of quiet anticipation and preparation. We are waiting for our Lord to come into the world as the baby Jesus.

ADVENT'S PRAYERS SHOULD be prayers of humble devotion and commitment, prayers for deliverance, prayers of gladness and joyful expectation, prayers that await the light of Christ coming into the world.

STEWARDSHIP IS SORT of an eternal Christmas. Stewardship means, of course, "All that I am and all that I have is in trust (or entrusted) to me from God." Advent is a time of preparation to share in the extravagant goodness and grace of God. A BLESSED ADVENT TO ALL!
