



CHRISTMAS WAFERS

THE CHRISTMAS WAFER (Oplatek)

commemorates a custom many centuries old. It is a tradition among Polish, Slovak, and Lithuanian families, which has been adopted by many other ethnic groups.

THE TRADITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

AFTER GRACE IS said and before sitting down to the Christmas Eve (or Christmas Day) meal, all present share the wafer as a symbol of love, brotherhood, innocence, and Christ. The father (or oldest person present) breaks the wafer with his wife (or next oldest person) exchanging wishes for health and happiness. Then the Oplatek is broken with others, beginning with the oldest child, also sharing wishes for happiness, health and good fortune. When the wafer is accepted, a willingness to forgive and forget is expressed; when it is offered to another, a willingness to share is denoted.

TO HELP CONTINUE this beautiful tradition of love and peace of the Christmas season, we make Christmas Wafers (Oplatek) available after all Masses.*

NEXT WEEKEND'S LITURGY Third Sunday of Advent

Introduction

TODAY WE ARE in the rhythm of both gratitude and yearning. Between the

two, there is great space for hope. We are learning to be a patient people, continuing on, grateful but also impatient, in hope. We don't give up hoping just because some of

the things we long for in God's reign of peace and justice have already happened. We're there, and yet we're not. So much remains unfinished; so many have not yet experienced what has been promised.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Is 61:1-2a, 10-11 The prophet announces glad tidings and vindication.

Ps Lk 1:46-48, 49-50, 53-54 My soul rejoices in my God. 1 Thess 5:16-24 Awaiting Christ's promised return. Jn 1:6-8, 19-28 "There is one coming among you..."

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

AFTER THE INFANCY Narratives of Christ, the Evangelist Matthew recounts the story of John the Baptist preaching in the region of the Jordan River. "Repent", says John, "for the Kingdom Of Heaven is at hand!"

ARCHBISHOP VIGNERON, IN his Pastoral Letter, Unleash the Gospel, tells us, "To repent means to "change one's mind" - to make a life-altering decision to turn away from sin and toward God. There is no true offer of the good news that does not also call for repentance. And calling people to repentance requires that we speak of sin and its consequence, including the ultimate consequence of eternal separation from God.......To speak of repentance is not fashionable today in a world that prefers to ignore sin, yet we who belong to Christ can testify that repentance is the way to forgiveness and freedom. It is the key that unlocks the mercy of God!"

THIS IS THE message that we, as Christian stewards must continually proclaim to our family, friends and our neighbors, "meeting them where they are", as Archbishop Vigneron so wisely points out.


Thank you so much for your great generosity and open-hearted support of St. Mary.

On November 21-24, some of our high school students had the opportunity to attend NCYC (National Catholic Youth Conference) in Indianapolis, IN. To say it was a life changing experience, is an understatement. It was an honor and joy for me to watch our kids grow in their faith and their relationship with Christ in just 3 days. Joined with 20,000 other high school students from around the country, we spent our days in concerts, hearing from wonderful Catholic speakers, had large group sessions and breakout sessions, had bible study together, Mass together and Adored our Lord in Eucharistic Adoration in Lucas Oil Stadium. NCYC is an experience that I will never forget. It made me see who Jesus and God were in just 3 days. It made me see why we believe in our Catholic faith. I remember Olivia telling me about this trip and how it was a great opportunity for any Catholic to go. At first, I didn't



want to go to this trip. I thought: "I rather go to a completely different place for 3 days". I didn't know what I was doing but something in me told me to go. So I said "yes". THE FAMILY OF five had no choice but to leave and drive north, packing everything that would fit in the old car and begin the journey from their southern state life. The uncomfortable living conditions they had endured had become untenable, exposing them to physical and emotional duress. Fortunately, a single family member lived in the Milford area, and offered them safe harbor and a shared home, and they looked forward to a new beginning in Michigan.

SHORTLY AFTER ARRIVING, their car broke down, and repairs exceeded the low value of the vehicle and the vehicle was scrapped. Undeterred, Emily got a part-time job with a retailer located 8 miles

away. Brian also obtained a job within a 30 minute drive. The lack of a vehicle imposed challenges which could not easily be met. When Emily could not get a ride, she walked half way (one hour), and took Lyft the second half, unwilling and unable to pay the cost for the full trip. Brian found rides until he couldn't, and then lost the job due to reliability.

THAT IS WHEN God came to the rescue, via a donated car to St Vincent de Paul. The car was in really good condition, but still required \$800 of service and repairs. Funded by donations of parishioners and St Mary Church, the car was



presented to Emily at the church lot, where she is shown above with one of her three children (ages 4, 5, and 7).

SHORTLY AFTER GETTING the car, Brian was able to secure a full time job at good pay.

FOR MANY OF us, a car is taken for granted; for many in need, not so. While they can carry the expense of an operational vehicle (gas, insurance and registration), they are unable to fund the purchase of a reliable used car, and the family faces job and income loss, with the possibility of eviction and homelessness without that transportation.

IN THE WORDS of Emily in reply to her permission to tell her story, "I hope this helps the church and others like me. Thank you so much for everything and I pray you help so many more people to come".
