

SAINT OF THE WEEK - BLESSED JUNIPERO SERRA - JULY 1



1713-1784

A Spanish missionary who is buried in California, Miguel José Serra was born on the Mediterranean island of Majorca. He entered the Franciscans in 1730, taking the name Junipero to honor an original companion of St. Francis of Assisi. He taught after being ordained but in 1749 volunteered for mission work among the Indians of Mexico and Texas. In 1767, the Franciscans under Father Serra took charge of the missions in Baja, California, and in 1769, he accompanied a military expedition into Alta (upper) California, where he founded nine of the 21 missions stretching from San Diego to Sonoma. Beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1988, he is the inspiration for Serra International, which encourages and affirms vocations. Pope Francis will preside at a Mass to canonize Blessed Junipero Serra on September 23, 2015, in Washington, DC. Thereafter, he will be known as St. Junipero Serra.

EL SANTO DE LA SEMANA - BEATO JUNÍPERO SERRA - 1º DE JULIO

Miguel José Serra, misionero español cuyos restos descansan en California, nació en la isla mediterránea de Mallorca. En 1730, ingresó al monasterio franciscano tomando el nombre de Junípero en honor al hermano compañero de San Francisco de Asís. Después de su ordenación se dedicó a la enseñanza pero luego, en 1749, se ofreció como voluntario para

hacer labor misionera entre los nativos de México y de Texas. En 1767, los franciscanos, bajo la dirección del padre Serra tomaron a su cargo las misiones en Baja, California y, en 1769, Serra acompañó a una expedición militar a Alta California donde fundó nueve de las 21 misiones, desde San Diego hasta Sonoma. En 1988, fue beatificado por el Papa Juan Pablo II y es la inspiración para Serra International, que anima y afirma vocaciones. El Papa Francisco presidirá una Misa para canonizar al Beato Junípero Serra el 23 de setiembre del 2015, en Washington, DC y, en adelante, será conocido como San Junípero Serra.

13th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:
FAITH, TRUST & COMPASSION

The first reading reminds us that all that God created is good! God's creation is meant to be alive and well. Through evil, death entered the world. This introduction to the two stories of illness and death in the Gospel helps us to see how throughout his ministry and teaching, Jesus gave a compassionate, healing response to the illnesses and death of those who believed. It is faith that empowers us to come to Jesus in our need. In life there are many times when we have recognized that our faith helps us get through difficult times, to see how God may be at work in our lives and in the world even when it seems dark or hopeless.

Jesus responds to a plea from a synagogue official, Jairus, whose daughter is deathly ill and comes to Jesus to ask for his help. The fact that Jairus is named in the Scriptures is an indication that he was known to the early Christian community, and possibly one of the many disciples who continued to follow Jesus throughout his public life. We do not know for certain, but we do know that his care for his daughter prompted him to make this personal faith-filled and public appeal to Jesus.

In contrast, there is an anonymous woman who has a deep belief, but who quietly approaches Jesus and in trusting faith touches his garment, believing that she will be healed. Jesus responds to her faith and courage by confirming her healing. Even after receiving the message that the daughter has died, Jesus continues his errand of mercy, going into the home of the official, raising her back to life.

Time and again, the words and actions of Jesus teach us that there are times when circumstances need to be challenged in the face of need and compassionate response. We, as disciples today, are called to be ready to take a risk or two – to look beyond externals and consider “What would Jesus do?” Another way of reflecting on today's Scriptures is to ask ourselves if we have the deep faith of Jairus and the woman who was healed. That kind of faith, trust and dependence on God are truly a witness in the world today! How do we approach Jesus in the midst of our needs? How do we believe Jesus would respond? Like Saints Peter and Paul whose feast we celebrate on Monday, our life's journey is a journey of growing in faith. Our God of love, mercy and healing is always with us.

Tanto en el Antiguo Testamento como en el Evangelio, Dios se revela hoy como el dador de todo bien y el sostén de nuestra existencia. Él sana nuestras heridas, como lo hiciera Jesús con aquellos que se encontraron con él “al otro lado del lago”.

La liturgia de hoy nos invita a ser agradecidos y a compartir nuestro agradecimiento con los más necesitados. Sería conveniente que en este domingo se destacaran un poco aquellos ministros laicos que llevan la Comunión a los enfermos de la comunidad y que así se convierten en signos vivos del Señor resucitado entre aquellos que no pueden unirse al resto de los feligreses en el banquete eucarístico. El resto de los ministros laicos de la comunidad pueden reflexionar sobre la frase de san Pablo a los Corintios en forma de pregunta: ¿De qué manera podemos ser pobres, siendo ricos, en nuestra sociedad actual? ¿Qué significan para nosotros la pobreza y la riqueza?

Pastoral Reflections

XIII Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our abundance or want in life are not measured by our material goods but by our nearness to God. Both in the first reading and in the Gospel reading today, God reveals himself as the giver of all that is good and the one who sustains our lives. He heals our wounds, as Jesus did with those he encountered on “the other side” of the lake.

Today's liturgy invites us to be grateful and to share our gratitude with the neediest among us. This is a good Sunday to highlight those lay ministers from the community who visit the sick and homebound, bringing them Communion and thus becoming signs of the risen Lord for those who cannot join the worshipping assembly at the eucharistic banquet. Other lay ministers in the community can reflect on the words of Saint Paul to the Corinthians by rephrasing them as questions: How can we be poor, while being rich, in today's society? What do poverty and wealth mean to us?
