

Martha, Mary and their brother Lazarus were evidently close friends of Jesus. He came to their home simply as a welcomed guest, rather than as one celebrating the conversion of a sinner like Zacchaeus or one unceremoniously received by a suspicious Pharisee. The sisters feel free to call on Jesus at their brother's death, even though a return to Judea at that time seems almost certain death.

No doubt Martha was an active sort of person. On one occasion (see Luke 10:38-42) she prepares the meal for Jesus and possibly his fellow guests and forthrightly states the obvious: All hands should pitch in to help with the dinner.

Feeding the World

With today's two accounts of feeding miracles and the psalm response about the Lord's hand feeding us, it is easy to gloss over the marvelous hymn in Ephesians. It is built around the most potent biblical numbers: one, three, and seven. The core of it is the word "one" expressed seven times. Three of these describe the church: one body, one Spirit, one hope; the next three are the foundations of the church: one Lord [Jesus], one faith, one baptism. All of these are bound up together in the one Father of all. While we might feel daunted by the prospect of duplicating the wonders worked by Elisha and Jesus in the feeding of multitudes, Ephesians gives us a more realistic way to live and "feed" others as the church: by living in humility and gentleness, by acting with patience, bearing with each other in love, and always seeking and striving to preserve unity through peace. Who among us cannot increase the way we "feed" the church and the world by living this way? We are always called upon to "feed" the world in the literal sense; but our mission as church tells us that others are also fed by the way we live and act each moment of each day.

Alimentado al Mundo

Al oír las narraciones de cómo Eliseo y Jesús multiplican los alimentos, y el salmo responsorial sobre como la mano del Señor nos alimenta, es fácil caer en la tentación de pasar por alto el maravilloso himno de la carta a los efesios en la Segunda lectura. El himno se centra en los números más potentes de la tradición bíblica: el uno, el tres y el siete. La médula del himno es el número uno, repetido siete veces. Tres de ellas se refieren a la Iglesia: un solo cuerpo, un solo Espíritu, como también una sola es la esperanza. Los próximas tres son los fundamentos de la Iglesia: un solo Señor, una sola fe, un solo bautismo. Y todos estos se juntan en un solo Dios y Padre de todos. La idea de repetir los milagros obrados por Eliseo y por Jesús al alimentar las multitudes nos desalienta, claro está, pero la carta a los efesios nos ofrece un modo más realizable de vivir como Iglesia y de alimentar a los demás en la Iglesia: ser siempre humildes y amables; ser comprensivos y soportarnos mutuamente con amor, y esforzarnos en mantenernos unidos en el Espíritu con el vínculo de la paz. ¿Quién de nosotros no puede "alimentar" a la comunidad de la Iglesia viviendo de esta manera? Es verdad que siempre estamos llamados a "alimentar" al mundo en el sentido literal de la palabra, pero nuestra misión como Iglesia también nos dice que a los demás también hay que alimentarlos por la manera en que vivimos y actuamos cada momento de cada día.

XVII Domingo Ordinario

En la carta a los Efesios, san Pablo le recuerda a sus lectores que el poder de Dios se manifiesta en el cuidado y el apoyo que se tienen los miembros de la comunidad. En la unidad de la fe, del bautismo y del Señor se pone en evidencia la fortaleza de la Iglesia que acoge a todos los que buscan a Dios y quieren saciar su hambre y su sed. Nos podemos imaginar que lo opuesto también sea cierto: la división de cualquier comunidad aleja a todos los que buscan la presencia de Dios en sus vidas. La abundancia física o espiritual de Dios, según narran las lecturas de hoy, se hace evidente cuando la fe prevalece sobre la duda.

Nuestra falta de recursos económicos en nuestras iglesias exige que oremos profundamente no sólo para que Dios nos ayude a resolver problemas inmediatos sino para que Dios le toque el corazón a los miembros de la comunidad y los invite a ser colaboradores o mayordomos de la parroquia. Dios concede lo que pedimos si hacemos de la oración una prioridad en una jornada diaria. Nuestros grupos parroquiales han de reflexionar sobre este tema durante el año litúrgico, especialmente cuando el tema surja de la palabra compartida en la liturgia, como hoy con la multiplicación de los panes y los peces.

17th SUNDAY
IN ORDINARY TIME:
JESUS: BREAD OF LIFE

One of the great things about Cycle B Sunday Liturgy is that in the midst of Summer Ordinary Time the unfolding of Mark's Gospel leads us to something awesome and unexpected.

The core of this Sunday's Scriptures is the Gospel recounting of Jesus feeding the multitudes with five loaves and two fish – one of few events recounted in all four Gospels. It is important as a foreshadowing of the Eucharist in the early Christian communities.

This particular section from John's Gospel, Chapter 6, is called the Bread of Life discourse, and we will hear portions of this chapter proclaimed in the weeks ahead – which puts us in the perfect place to reflect on the meaning and power of the Eucharist in our lives. Jesus took the fish and loaves, gave thanks and distributed them to the people who were there, listening to Jesus, perhaps seeking healing and to witness the miracles Jesus was known to perform. This story is related to the Last Supper as recounted in the other Gospels, affirming the power of Jesus and divine providence.

No matter why the people came – that they were there is important to Jesus and the disciples – that they are hungry and are fed. Their witnessing the miracle prompts the people to want to make Jesus their king. What is our parallel today? We witness the miracle of Jesus present among us every time we come to worship through the Liturgy: Jesus is present, the Church tells us, in the gathered people, in the Word, in the priest and in the Eucharist. If we truly believe this awesome truth, our hearts and lives are bound to be converted – to be changed as we are nourished by the Bread of Life.

We are called, not so much to follow Jesus across the Sea of Galilee, but throughout the "sea" of our daily tasks and decisions. In the words of the Morning Offering – our "prayers, works, joys and sufferings" -- that's where we encounter opportunities to witness to Jesus whom we receive as the Bread of Life. Jesus, through his disciples, distributed the loaves and fishes, and we are called to share the abundance of graces received in the Eucharist through our love and service to one another. God bless!
