AT THE TABLE

In today's first reading, Wisdom is imagined as a woman rich in poise and grace. She moves smoothly and confidently about her temple-like home. She doesn't flutter about, nervous with worry. Wisdom sends her maidens to invite all to her open house. The guests do not possess any particular genius or insight. They need only be a people of good will and common sense. They are summoned to leave behind foolishness and to find for themselves a place at Wisdom's table. There they may and can eat and drink deeply.

Today's Gospel draws us back to the table of the Eucharist. Jesus addresses those who seek to understand his words and, sadly, those who seek to avoid them. As people born of God, we are called and equipped to seek God's will and act on it.

SAINT BERNARD - 1090–1153 - Memorial—August 20

Known as Bernard of Clairvaux, this French abbot and Doctor of the Church is considered the second founder of the Cistercians. He entered the relatively new monastery at Citeaux in 1113 with four of his own brothers and 27 friends and later founded the monastery at Clairvaux, which gave birth to 68 other communities. Despite poor health and his devotion to personal mortification, Bernard was an early Western European rock star: He was consulted by popes and kings, battled heresies, and supported the Second Crusade. The sick and maimed lined the roads he traveled, hoping for a miracle. Dante Alighieri chose Bernard as his final guide in "Paradiso," at the end of "The Divine Comedy." He is the patron of Gibraltar.

SANTO BERNARDO - 1090–1153 -Memorial—20 de Agosto

Conocido como Bernardo de Claraval, este abad francés y Doctor de la Iglesia es considerado el segundo fundador de los Cistercienses. En 1113, él ingresó al relativamente nuevo monasterio de Citeaux con cuatro de sus hermanos y 27 amigos y, más adelante, fundó un monasterio en Claraval, del cual surgieron 68 otras comunidades. A pesar de su delicada salud y de su devoción por la mortificación, Bernardo fue una de las primeras estrellas del rock de Europa Occidental: a él le consultaban papas y reyes, luchó contra las herejías y apoyó a la Segunda Cruzada. Los enfermos y los lisiados lo esperaban en los caminos que el recorría, esperando un milagro. Dante Alighieri escogió a Bernardo como su último guía en "Paraíso", al final de "La Divina Comedia". Él es el patrón de Gibraltar.

Stewardship

We are to be content with what we have.

"Let your life be free from love of money, but be content with what you have, for he has said, 'I will never forsake you or abandon you'" (Heb. 13:5).



Applying Bible Principles

Suppose that God allowed you to have one wish. Without limit, you could have anything you desire. You could have unlimited wealth. You could have perfect health and live 1,000 years — or more. You could — like Solomon — have great wisdom. Whatever you want, you may have it. But you only get one wish. What would you choose?

Sad to say, many people would choose great wealth and material possessions. Unfortunately, that would not be a good choice. Listen to the counsel of God as expressed in Proverbs 27:20 through Solomon, one of the richest people who ever lived — “. . . the eyes of mortals can never satisfied.” The behavior and attitude which always wants more has a name: Greed, and it demonstrates itself in our lives as though we were at an auction. If we have \$5, we want \$10; if we have \$10, we want \$20; if we have \$20 we want \$30. Solomon went on to say in Ecclesiastes 5:19, “The covetous are never satisfied with money, nor lovers of wealth with their gain.”

A better choice would be to ask for God’s perspective on life and all that life entails. When we see life as God does, we realize that everything belongs to Him, that we are just managers and stewards, and that only what is done for Him will endure for eternity. When we have God’s perspective, as expressed in a contemporary translation, we will be able to say with the Apostle Paul, “. . . I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content.”

When we have God’s perspective, we will accept with a spirit of peace and restfulness whatever He entrusts to us. And when we have God’s perspective, we will put into practice the truth of Hebrews 13:5 — “Let your life be free from love of money, but be content with what you have, for he has said, 'I will never forsake you or abandon you.'”

Mayordomía

Aplicación de los Principios de la Biblia

Supongamos que Dios le ha permitido tener un deseo. Sin límite, podría tener cualquier cosa que desee. Usted podría tener riqueza ilimitada. Usted podría tener salud perfecta y vivir 1.000 años, o más. Usted podría — como Salomón — tener gran sabiduría. Como quiera, usted puede tenerlo. Pero sólo un deseo. ¿Qué escogería usted?

Tristemente, muchas personas elegirían grandes riquezas y posesiones materiales. Por desgracia, eso no sería una buena opción. Escuchar el Consejo de Dios tal como se expresa en Proverbios presentéis a través de Salomón, una de las personas más ricas que jamás haya vivido, "... los ojos de los mortales nunca pueden satisfacer." El comportamiento y actitud que siempre quiere más tiene un nombre: avaricia y se demuestra en nuestras vidas como si fuésemos en una subasta. Si tenemos \$5, queremos \$10; Si tenemos \$10, queremos \$20; Si tenemos \$20 queremos \$30. Salomón llegó a decir en Eclesiastés 5:19, "el codicioso no está nunca satisfecho con dinero, ni los amantes de la riqueza con su ganancia."

Una mejor opción sería solicitar la perspectiva de Dios sobre la vida y todo lo que implica la vida. Cuando vemos la vida como Dios lo hace, nos damos cuenta de que todo le pertenece, que somos sólo los gerentes y administradores, y que sólo lo que se hace para él perdurará para la eternidad. Cuando tengamos la perspectiva de Dios, expresado en una traducción contemporánea, podremos decir con el apóstol Paul, "... He aprendido en cualquier situación ser contenido."

Cuando tenemos la perspectiva de Dios, vamos a aceptar con un espíritu de paz y la tranquilidad lo que nos confía. Y cuando tengamos la perspectiva de Dios, vamos a poner en práctica la verdad de Hebreos 13:5 — "dejó su vida estar libre del amor al dinero, sino contentarse con lo que tiene, porque él dijo, 'Nunca te abandonaré ni abandono.'"

**FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION
OF MARY - 20th SUNDAY
IN ORDINARY TIME:
MARY AND FAITH**

This weekend we have a “split” between the liturgies of Saturday and Sunday. Saturday is our parish feast day – the celebration of the Assumption of Mary into heaven. The Church’s celebration of Mary, her life, faith and Assumption is a major feast. The teaching, proclaimed as an infallible dogma on November 1, 1950, has been a part of our Church belief and heritage since the early years of the church. There has never been a place designated as the tomb of Mary, Mother of Jesus, not even in Ephesus, where Tradition tells us that she lived the latter years of her life.

The first reading for Mary’s feast is from the Book of Revelation, a reading of strong symbolism and imagery of the Church’s struggle against evil and the power of Christ Jesus to overcome evil. The Gospel gives us an entirely different feeling – the song of Elizabeth praising God’s goodness as she encounter Mary at the time of the visitation. Mary’s response, though not included in the reading, is an extraordinary prayer of gratitude and humility. Reading all of Luke, chapter 1, gives us an idea of the depth of faith of Mary, Elizabeth and Zechariah.

Sunday’s liturgy continues the unfolding of the Bread of Life discourse from John’s Gospel. The proximity to Mary’s feast gives a deeper meaning to the words of Jesus “I am the living bread that came down from heaven.” Meditating on the selection from Proverbs in the first reading, the selection from Paul’s Letter to the Ephesians, and the Gospel weaves a pattern of prayer, mystery, faithfulness and challenge, not only for our lives, but imagining what the life and faith of Mary would have been. The Responsorial Psalm 34 is particularly appropriate in proclaiming the goodness of the Lord. Not only because of Mary’s feast and the Bread of Life promised and given by Jesus, but also because we are able to celebrate and receive Eucharist as a community of faith, our prayers are those of gratitude, praise and joy!
