ST. JOHN VIANNEY - 1786-1859 - August 4

Born near Lyon, France, this farmer's son studied for the priesthood for many years and eventually was ordained, more for his devoutness and good will than for other qualities. But he became a model parish priest in Arsen-Dombes, where he served for 40 years. He was devoted to his parishioners and became famous for rigorous preaching and his insights in the confessional. The Cure of Ars, as he was known, spent up to 18 hours a day hearing the confessions of pilgrims who sought him out. He is the patron of parish priests.

SAN JUAN MARÍA VIANNEY - 1786-1859 - 4 de agosto

Nació en Lyon, Francia, y era hijo de campesinos. Por muchos años, él estudió para el sacerdocio y, finalmente, fue ordenado más que nada por su devoción y buena voluntad que por otras cualidades. Pero luego se convirtió en un párroco modelo en Arsen-Dombes, en donde prestó servicios por 40 años. Él estaba dedicado a sus feligreses y era famoso por sus severos sermones y por su percepción en el confesionario. El Cura de Ars, como se le llamaba, pasaba hasta 18 horas al día escuchando confesiones de los peregrinos quienes lo buscaban para confesarse. Él es el patrón de los párrocos.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR CHILDREN

What is RCIA for children?

The RCIA for children is a process that invites children, ages 7 to 14, interested in searching the Catholic Faith to discover what the Catholic Church teaches and believes. It is open to unbaptized children, children baptized in another faith, and children who may be baptized but who have not practiced their Catholic faith regularly.



Like the RCIA for adults this process is accomplished in a comfortable, friendly and informal environment, but especially designed for children. Separate sessions of Catechesis (education) are presented in dialog format. Certain Rites are celebrated in the church and are combined with the Adults at the same Mass.

RCIA for children is two years of formation and begins Monday, October 5th at 5:30-6:45 pm.

An orientation meeting for parents will be September 28th at 5:30 pm.

MARRIAGE Unique for a Reason

This article provides talking points on key messages related to Church teaching on marriage in the wake of the June 2015 U.S. Supreme Court ruling that the 14th Amendment requires states to issue marriage licenses to two persons of the same sex and recognize same sex "marriages" that were contracted in another state.

The Supreme Court

The Supreme Court ruled on June 26, 2015 that the 14th Amendment requires states to issue marriage licenses to two persons of the same sex and recognize same sex "marriages" that were contracted in another state. "Mandating marriage redefinition across the country is a tragic error that harms the common good and most vulnerable among us, especially children" (Archbishop Kurtz).

Definitions Matter

Marriage is and can only be the union of one man and one woman. It is the only institution that unites a man and a woman with each other and with any child who comes from their union. Only a man and a woman can become husband and wife, father and mother, together.

Sexual Difference

Sexual difference, male and female, is essential for marriage and children. Our bodies matter—we don't just have a body but are a body. Without this basis, there is no limit to what "marriage" can mean.

Marriage is natural

Marriage is a natural institution that predates government. Every human society has acknowledged that the sexual union of man and woman matters because it creates the next generation. While Jesus elevates Christian marriage to a sacrament, the complementarity of the sexes and the natural meaning of marriage can be known through reason without appealing to Scripture.

Children

Every child has a mother and a father and deserves to be loved and raised by them. While some circumstances may prevent this, marriage is the primary way society protects this right of children.

Mothers and fathers matter

Only a man can be a father; only a woman can be a mother. Both are irreplaceable. A child should not be deliberately deprived of either one.

Single Parents

Single parents and others often make great sacrifices to raise children. They deserve our respect and support. The key point is not to deliberately or intentionally deprive children of their mother or father or ignore their rights.

Adoptive Families

If circumstances preclude a child's staying with his or her natural parents, the optimal alternative is for a married man and woman to become for that child a father and a mother united in an exclusively faithful commitment for life.

Dignity of the Human Person

All persons have inviolable dignity and deserve love and respect. Redefining marriage furthers no one's rights, least of all those of children.

Equality and Rights

Affirming the true definition of marriage denies no one their basic rights. Rather, it affirms the equal dignity of women and men and safeguards the rights of children.

Discrimination

Unjust discrimination is always wrong. Treating different things differently is not unjust discrimination. Protecting marriage is a matter of justice.

Same-Sex Attraction and the Church

The experience of same-sex attraction is a reality that calls for compassion, sensitivity, pastoral care and attention. Support groups, such as Courage and Encourage, are an important part of the Church's pastoral ministries. (See USCCB, Ministry to Persons with a Homosexual Inclination [2006]: p. 22.)

Religious Freedom

Redefining marriage in the law changes thousands of laws at once. It sets the Church's teaching and witness about marriage in opposition to the law. It will cause innumerable conflicts between the state and religious institutions and individuals. There are, in fact, already numerous examples of this.

GOD'S WORK

We are so busy! Most of us have more than one job to do, and we never seem to have enough time. We are workers, volunteers, parents, friends, and most of us are more than one thing at a time. But which of these is the work of God?

We seldom view our ordinary work as being the work of God. We may think that we have to be ministers or priests, missionaries or charity workers, engaged full-time in works formally identified as being "God's work." But everything we do with a faithful heart and with love for others is God's work. We each have our own role to fill in the world, and many gifts are necessary. We cannot always see the direct connection of our daily work to the plan of God. But we trust and we believe that God leads us to do what is needed, where it is needed. What is "God's work?" "This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent" (John 6:29).

He watched dumbfounded as the old nag came in last. In a state of shock, he went to the track area where the Priest was. Confronting Him, he demanded, "Father"! "What happened"? "All day long you blessed horses and they all won". "Then in the last race, the horse you blessed lost by a mile". "Now, thanks to you I've lost every cent of my savings"!

The Priest nodded wisely and with sympathy. "Son", he said, "that's the problem with you Protestants, you can't tell the difference between a simple blessing and the last rites".

18th SUNDAY
IN ORDINARY TIME:
CHRIST, THE LIVING BREAD

The Scriptures of today's liturgy continue the theme of the Eucharist, the Bread of Life, in both the readings from Exodus and the Gospel of John. We hear how the Israelites were fed quail and manna by God's bounty, giving them both strength for the journey and a deeper conviction that God was protecting them. In the Gospel we hear Jesus promising the bread of God to the disciples – that he himself is the Bread of Life. Those who come to him will never hunger, those who believe will never thirst! This promise echoes the promise Jesus made to the woman at the well in Samaria (John's Gospel, Chapter 4) – that those who drink the living water which Jesus offers will never thirst again.

Reflecting on these words of Jesus, and on the teachings of the Church about Eucharist as the source and summit of our faith life as Catholics, we cannot but be in awe as we celebrate the Eucharist! Each time we gather as a community of believers at the Liturgy of the Mass, we are invited to hear again the prayers and beliefs of the Church, the words of Scripture and to receive Eucharist to nourish us along the daily and weekly paths of our lives. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians calls his people – and us – to renew our spirits, our minds, and put on our new self.

We have been offered the Bread of Life, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ as our spiritual nourishment and the community of believers as our tangible support. The Church offers us the gift and strength of Eucharist and the other sacraments. The Church also gives us the challenge to live as faithful disciples – to love and serve the Lord by loving and serving one another each day as we offer our days – our prayers, works, joys and sufferings – as our way of being disciples and apostles.

Yes, there is the gift of the Bread of life, and yes, there is a cost: the challenge to live what we believe, to become what we have received – the Body of Christ in the world today. Know that God is with you always! May we remember how blessed we are to be nourished by the Bread of Life and be challenged by that Eucharist to be life-nourishing for others. God bless!
