A WORD FROM FR. ANDREW

My dear parishioners and friends,

FORGIVENESS!!! It is something that we are all in need of. After all, none of us are perfect and we all make mistakes. FORGIVENESS!!! It is something that we all hope that we can extend to someone who wrongs us. And yet we want to hold on...never let go. FORGIVENESS!!! So many times it is not only difficult to accept, but it is even more difficult to extend.

When we are wronged, when someone has betrayed our trust in a relationship, many times we find it difficult to mend or renew the broken relationship with the individual(s) involved. Perhaps however, there is a way to become a more forgiving person. Perhaps we could just take some time to begin to look at and remember something positive or good in the individual who has wronged us. Today more than ever I find it almost incomprehensible to believe that we, who call ourselves Christian, cannot see or find goodness in even the greatest of sinners. All 3 readings this weekend remind us of just how important it is to be able to forgive. It is extended by the Hebrew God in the Old Testament. Paul shows us another example in his letter to Timothy. And Jesus himself holds it up as a hallmark of a Christian...a true disciple. The recent crisis in our church regarding clergy abuse has tried my resolve in this regard.

I find the depravation and self-serving attitudes and acts of so many in our church to be an absolute abomination. But regardless of the varying degrees of sinfulness which has occurred, I pray to God that we will find, in our hearts, some way to remember at least one good thing that each person has done. This will never negate the atrocities that have been committed. But hopefully it will help us to grow in a greater awareness of the fact that even a child of God can still choose to go astray and to allow the forces of evil to take hold. In your dealing with all of your brothers and sisters, with your family members and friends, with those who you once loved but who have betrayed you, perhaps you can pray that you may be able to find something good in her/him so that you can find within your heart the ability to forgive. Holding on to anger and resentment is the crowning jewel of hatred and evil. Pray daily for the courage to turn all things over to the care of God. For He alone is our judge.
